AN ACT

Amending the act of December 19, 1988 (P.L.737, No.156), 1 2 entitled "An act providing for the licensing of clubs to conduct games of chance, for the licensing of persons to 3 distribute games of chance, for the registration of 4 manufacturers of games of chance, and for suspensions and 5 6 revocations of licenses and permits; requiring records; 7 providing for local referendum by electorate; and prescribing penalties," defining the term "municipality." 8

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. Section 3 of the act of December 19, 1988

12 (P.L.737, No.156), known as the Local Option Small Games of

13 Chance Act, is amended by adding a definition to read:

14 Section 3. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 1 ***

2 <u>"Municipality." A city, borough, incorporated town or</u>

3 township or a home rule municipality formerly classified as a

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4 city, borough, incorporated town or township.

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6 SECTION 2. SECTION 5 OF THE ACT IS AMENDED TO READ:

7 SECTION 5. PRIZE LIMITS.

8 (A) INDIVIDUAL PRIZE LIMIT.--[THE] <u>EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN</u>
9 <u>THIS SECTION, THE</u> MAXIMUM CASH VALUE WHICH MAY BE AWARDED FOR
10 ANY SINGLE CHANCE SHALL BE \$500.

11 (B) WEEKLY LIMIT.--NO MORE THAN \$5,000 IN CASH OR 12 MERCHANDISE SHALL BE AWARDED BY ANY CLUB IN ANY SEVEN-DAY 13 PERIOD.

14 (C) LIMIT ON RAFFLES.--NO MORE THAN \$5,000 IN CASH OR
15 MERCHANDISE SHALL BE AWARDED IN RAFFLES IN ANY CALENDAR MONTH.
16 <u>AS LONG AS THE MONTHLY LIMIT IS NOT EXCEEDED, THERE IS NO LIMIT</u>
17 <u>ON INDIVIDUAL PRIZES.</u>

18 (D) EXCEPTION.--A CLUB MAY CONDUCT A RAFFLE AND AWARD A
19 PRIZE OR PRIZES VALUED IN EXCESS OF [\$500] <u>\$5,000</u> EACH ONLY
20 UNDER THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

(1) THE LICENSING AUTHORITY HAS ISSUED A SPECIAL PERMITFOR THE RAFFLE UNDER SECTION 10.

23 (2) NO CLUB SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE MORE THAN TWO
24 SPECIAL PERMITS IN ANY CALENDAR YEAR.

25 (3) ONLY ONE RAFFLE MAY BE CONDUCTED UNDER EACH SPECIAL
26 PERMIT.

27 (4) THE TOTAL CASH VALUE OF ALL PRIZES SHALL BE NO MORE
28 THAN \$25,000 FOR EACH RAFFLE.

29 Section 2 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
