AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled, 1 as amended, "An act relating to the finances of the State 2 3 government; providing for the settlement, assessment, 4 collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts 5 due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth, б 7 or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the 8 proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other 9 disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the 10 possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims 11 against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and 12 appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to 13 the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth 14 and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting 15 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, 16 17 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes 18 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of 19 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of 20 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of 21 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every 22 department, board, commission, and officer of the State 23 government, every political subdivision of the State, and certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, 24 25 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or 26 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws

1 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or 2 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the 3 Commonwealth, " further providing for interest penalties on 4 5 Commonwealth accounts. 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 1507(b) and (f) of the act of April 9, 8

9 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, amended or 10 added December 13, 1982 (P.L.1155, No.266) and December 12, 1984 11 (P.L.982, No.196), are amended to read:

12 Section 1507. Interest Penalties on Commonwealth Accounts.-13 * * *

14 (b) (1) Interest penalties payable on amounts due to a 15 business concern or qualified small business concern under this 16 section shall be paid to the business concern for the period 17 beginning on the day after the required payment date and ending on the date on which payment on the amount due is made[, except 18 no interest penalty shall be paid if payment for the complete 19 20 delivered item of property or service concerned is made on or 21 before the fifteenth calendar day after the required payment 22 datel.

(2) Interest shall be computed at the rate determined by the Secretary of Revenue for interest payments on overdue taxes or the refund of taxes as provided in sections 806 and 806.1 and any subsequent amendments to those sections.

(3) Interest may be paid by separate payment made to a
business concern or qualified small business concern within
thirty days of payment of the original invoice.

30 (4) Any amount of an interest penalty imposed because of a 31 debt which remains unpaid at the end of any thirty day period 32 shall be added to the principle amount of the debt and 19890H0347B0382 - 2 - 1 thereafter interest penalties shall accrue on such added amount.

3 (f) For the purposes of this section:

4 (1) The term "Commonwealth agency" shall include, the
5 Executive and all departments, boards, bureaus and agencies
6 hereunder, all independent agencies as defined by section 102 of
7 the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the
8 "Commonwealth Attorneys Act," and the Auditor General, the Board
9 of Arbitration of Claims, the State Treasurer and the Public
10 Utility Commission.

11 (2) The term "qualified small business concern" means any 12 independently owned and operated for-profit business concern 13 employing [one hundred] <u>two hundred fifty</u> or fewer employes. 14 (3) The term "business concern" means any person engaged in 15 a trade or business and operating as contractors with 16 Commonwealth agencies, and nonprofit entities operating as 17 contractors with Commonwealth agencies.

18 (4) An invoice shall be considered a "proper invoice" when 19 it contains or is accompanied by such substantiating 20 documentation as the Secretary of Budget may require by 21 regulation, and as the Commonwealth agency involved may require 22 by regulation or contract.

(5) An invoice shall be deemed to have been received by anagency on the later of:

(i) the date on which the agency's designated [payment office or finance center] <u>office to receive such an invoice</u> actually receives a proper invoice; or

28 (ii) the date on which such agency accepts the property or 29 service concerned.

30 (6) A payment shall be considered made on the date on which 19890H0347B0382 - 3 - a check for such payment is [dated] <u>delivered or placed in the</u>
 <u>United States mail</u>.

3 (7) This section shall not apply to any "public contracts"
4 subject to the act of November 26, 1978 (P.L.1309, No.317),
5 referred to as the Public Works Contract Regulation Law.
6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
