AN ACT

- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Timber
- 7 Conversion Act.
- 8 Section 2. Declaration of policy.
- 9 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 10 (1) Disreputable timber operators are cutting and
- 11 removing the timber of others without permission.
- 12 (2) The timber operators referred to in paragraph (1)
- are avoiding criminal liability by claiming mistake.
- 14 (3) Civil liability for action under paragraph (1) is
- 15 limited to damages in the amount of the value of the timber.

- 1 (4) Damages under paragraph (3) do not protect property
- 2 owners from having their timber cut without their consent and
- do not discourage the depletion of a valuable natural
- 4 resource.
- 5 (5) Penal ADDITIONAL CIVIL damages are necessary to
- 6 protect property owners from having their timber cut without

- 7 their consent and to discourage the depletion of a valuable
- 8 natural resource.
- 9 Section 3. Cause of action.
- 10 (a) Cutting timber. A person who intentionally or
- 11 negligently cuts the timber of another person without the
- 12 consent of that person shall be liable to that person in an
- 13 amount equal to twice the value of the timber.
- 14 (b) Removing timber. A person who intentionally or
- 15 negligently removes the timber of another person without the
- 16 consent of that person shall be liable to that person in an
- 17 amount equal to twice the value of the timber.
- 18 (c) Cumulation. Damages under subsections (a) and (b) are
- 19 cumulative.
- 20 Section 4. Applicability.
- 21 This act shall apply to actions that are commenced on or
- 22 after the effective date of this act.
- 23 Section 5. Effective date.
- 24 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
- 25 SECTION 3. CAUSE OF ACTION FOR CONVERSION OF TIMBER.
- 26 A PERSON WHO CUTS OR REMOVES THE TIMBER OF ANOTHER PERSON
- 27 WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THAT PERSON SHALL, IN ADDITION TO ALL
- 28 OTHER DAMAGES OR OTHER CIVIL REMEDIES PROVIDED BY LAW, BE LIABLE
- 29 TO THAT PERSON IN A CIVIL ACTION FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT OF
- 30 DAMAGES EQUAL TO THE VALUE OF THE TIMBER CUT OR REMOVED. FOR

- 1 PURPOSES OF THIS ACT, TIMBER SHALL BE TREES, LOGS OR WOODED LAND
- 2 WHICH CONSTITUTE A MERCHANTABLE SOURCE OF WOOD.
- 3 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 4 THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
