## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 4 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other 18 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 commissions shall be determined, providing for a Bureau of 21 Drug Investigation within the Pennsylvania State Police.

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 23 hereby enacts as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
- 2 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
- 3 section to read:
- 4 <u>Section 713. Bureau of Drug Investigation. -- There is hereby</u>
- 5 established within the Pennsylvania State Police the Bureau of
- 6 Drug Investigation. The bureau shall be headed by a director who
- 7 shall be appointed by the Governor subject to a majority vote by
- 8 the Senate. This bureau shall:
- 9 (1) Have primary responsibility for conducting and
- 10 coordinating Statewide and regional drug investigations.
- 11 (2) Be responsible for developing a Drug Strike Task Force
- 12 <u>for target areas within the Commonwealth.</u>
- 13 (3) Provide assistance to local law enforcement agencies,
- 14 including, but not limited to, intelligence reports and manpower
- 15 where appropriate.
- 16 (4) Cooperate with the Attorney General and district
- 17 attorneys in the investigation and prosecution of drug cases.
- 18 (5) Promulgate regulations for disbursing funds, provided
- 19 through State and Federal sources, to State and local law
- 20 <u>enforcement agencies to be used in covert operations to buy</u>
- 21 <u>drugs</u>. These regulations shall be developed so as to insure that
- 22 local law enforcement agencies have reasonable and adequate
- 23 access to the funds.
- 24 (6) File an annual report with the Governor and the General
- 25 Assembly, which details the effectiveness of the bureau's
- 26 <u>efforts</u>, including, but not limited to, arrests and convictions.
- 27 This report shall make specific recommendations regarding future
- 28 law enforcement efforts.
- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
