AN ACT

Amending the act of November 26, 1975 (P.L.438, No.124), 2 entitled, as amended, "An act establishing child protective 3 services; providing procedures for reporting and 4 investigating the abuse of children; establishing and 5 providing access to a Statewide central register and pending complaint file on child abuse; investigating such reports; 7 providing for taking protective action including taking a 8 child into protective custody; placing duties on the 9 Department of Public Welfare and county children and youth 10 social service agencies; establishing child protective services in each county children and youth social service 11 agency; and providing penalties, providing for unlawful 12 persuasion and false reporting of child abuse. 13 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 15 16 Section 1. The act of November 26, 1975 (P.L.438, No.124), known as the Child Protective Services Law, is amended by adding 18 sections to read: Section 12.1. Unlawful persuasion. -- An adult who 19 20 intentionally and knowingly causes or persuades a child to make 21 an allegation of child abuse which the adult has no reasonable

- 1 grounds to believe is true commits a misdemeanor of the second
- 2 <u>degree</u>. If the adult has the malicious intent to expose the
- 3 <u>alleged child abuser to public hatred, contempt or ridicule or</u>
- 4 to criminal investigation, the offense is a misdemeanor of the
- 5 first degree.
- 6 Section 12.2. False reporting. -- A person who makes a report
- 7 of suspected child abuse under this act without having
- 8 reasonable grounds to believe the report to be true commits a
- 9 <u>misdemeanor of the second degree</u>. If the person has the
- 10 <u>malicious intent to expose the alleged child abuser to public</u>
- 11 hatred, contempt or ridicule or to criminal investigation, the
- 12 <u>offense is a misdemeanor of the first degree.</u>
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
