## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the availability
- 3 of information regarding arrearage in support to consumer
- 4 credit bureau organizations.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 4303 of Title 23 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 9 § 4303. Information to consumer credit bureau.
- 10 (a) General rule. -- Information regarding the amount of
- 11 arrearages owed by an obligor shall be made available to any
- 12 consumer credit bureau organization upon the request of the
- 13 organization[, subject to the following:
- 14 (1) Where the amount of arrearages is less than \$1,000,
- information regarding the amount shall be made available at
- 16 the option of the domestic relations section of the county in

- 1 which the order of support was entered.
- 2 (2)]. The information shall be available only after the
- 3 obligor owing the arrearages has been notified of the
- 4 proposed action and given a period not to exceed 20 days to
- 5 contest the accuracy of the information. The notice shall be
- 6 as provided by local rule of the court of common pleas.
- 7 (b) Fee.--A fee for furnishing the information in an amount
- 8 not exceeding the actual cost thereof may be imposed on the
- 9 requesting organization by the domestic relations office.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
