## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the
- 3 sentencing of certain public employees.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 9720. Sentences for certain public officials.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- Any public official or public employee
- 10 who commits any of the offenses set forth in this section,
- 11 through his public office or position or when his public
- 12 employment places him in a position to commit the crime, shall
- 13 be sentenced to the next higher grade of punishment than that
- 14 otherwise provided by law.
- (b) Offenses enumerated.--

- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
