## AN ACT

Amending the act of December 3, 1959 (P.L.1688, No.621), 1 2 entitled, as amended, "An act to promote the health, safety 3 and welfare of the people of the Commonwealth by broadening the market for housing for persons and families of low and 4 5 moderate income and alleviating shortages thereof, and by 6 assisting in the provision of housing for elderly persons 7 through the creation of the Pennsylvania Housing Finance 8 Agency as a public corporation and government 9 instrumentality; providing for the organization, membership 10 and administration of the agency, prescribing its general powers and duties and the manner in which its funds are kept 11 12 and audited, empowering the agency to make housing loans to 13 qualified mortgagors upon the security of insured and 14 uninsured mortgages, defining qualified mortgagors and 15 providing for priorities among tenants in certain instances, prescribing interest rates and other terms of housing loans, 16 17 permitting the agency to acquire real or personal property, permitting the agency to make agreements with financial 18 institutions and Federal agencies, providing for the purchase 19 20 by persons of low and moderate income of housing units, and approving the sale of housing units, permitting the agency to 21 22 sell housing loans, providing for the promulgation of 23 regulations and forms by the agency, prescribing penalties 24 for furnishing false information, empowering the agency to 25 borrow money upon its own credit by the issuance and sale of bonds and notes and by giving security therefor, permitting 26 the refunding, redemption and purchase of such obligations by 27

the agency, prescribing remedies of holders of such bonds and 1 notes, exempting bonds and notes of the agency, the income 2 therefrom, and the income and revenues of the agency from 3 taxation, except transfer, death and gift taxes; making such 4 5 bonds and notes legal investments for certain purposes; and indicating how the act shall become effective," further 6 7 providing for membership of the agency by adding legislative 8 members.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania10 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 202 of the act of December 3, 1959 (P.L.1688, No.621), known as the Housing Finance Agency Law, amended December 16, 1986 (P.L.1666, No.189), is amended to read:

15 Section 202. Agency Membership. -- The members of the agency 16 shall be the Secretary of Community Affairs, the State 17 Treasurer, the Secretary of Commerce and the Secretary of Banking, and the respective successors in office of each of them 18 19 [and], six [additional] members whom the Governor shall 20 appoint[.] and four members of the General Assembly, as follows: 21 two members of the Senate, one appointed by the President pro tempore and the other by the Minority Leader, and two members of 22 23 the House of Representatives, one appointed by the Speaker and 24 the other by the Minority Leader. One of the members of the 25 agency appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of 26 the Senate shall be a representative of a community-based 27 nonprofit group which assists low-income and moderate-income 28 individuals in housing matters. Annually at the first meeting held during the calendar year, the members shall elect one of 29 30 the members to serve as chairperson. The members initially 31 appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of one, two, three, four, five and six years, respectively, the particular 32 term of each to be designated by the Governor at the time of 33

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appointment. The terms of all their successors shall be six 1 2 years each, except that any person appointed to fill a vacancy 3 shall serve only for the unexpired term. The terms of the 4 legislative appointees shall be the length of their term of office in the General Assembly. Every member's term shall extend 5 until his successor is appointed and qualified. Any 6 <u>gubernatorial</u> appointment of a member of the agency made 7 8 hereafter shall be subject to the advice and consent of a majority of all the members of the Senate. Any appointed member 9 10 of the agency shall be eligible for reappointment. The members 11 of the agency shall not receive compensation for their services 12 as members, but shall receive reimbursement for all necessary 13 expenses incurred in connection with the performance of their duties as members. A member who fails to attend meetings for 14 15 three consecutive months shall forfeit his seat unless the 16 chairperson of the agency, upon written request from the member, 17 finds that the member should be excused from a meeting because 18 of illness or the death of an immediate family member. 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
