A RESOLUTION

Urging the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service 1 2 to work with Federal, State and local agencies in obtaining and utilizing drug-related information in the possession of 3 4 those agencies; and memorializing Congress to provide for 5 forfeiture of property of deported drug offenders. б WHEREAS, Federal, State and local agencies frequently come into possession of information which could be of service to the 7 8 United States Immigration and Naturalization Service; and 9 WHEREAS, Forfeiture of property would be a fitting punishment for persons deported for drug offenses; therefore be it 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 11 12 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the United States Immigration 13 and Naturalization Service to work with Federal, State and local agencies in order to obtain and utilize any and all information 14 these agencies might have which would help the United States 15 16 Immigration and Naturalization Service in the war against drugs,

particularly information pertaining to the sale and use of drugs
 by persons known to the Federal, State and local authorities;
