AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 18 19 20 commissions shall be determined," providing for a separate 21 office in the Department of Public Welfare to administer the 22 CASH AND CRISIS COMPONENTS OF THE Low-Income Home Energy 23 Assistance Program; AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

10	disproportionately adverse effects on their income resulting	
11	from increasing utility ENERGY prices.	<
12	(3) SOUND PUBLIC POLICY DICTATES THAT ASSISTING LOW-INCOME	<
13	HOUSEHOLDS IN MEETING THEIR ENERGY NEEDS MUST INCLUDE A	
14	COMPONENT TO MAKE ENERGY MORE AFFORDABLE BY PERMANENTLY REDUCING	
15	ENERGY COSTS THROUGH WEATHERIZATION.	
16	$\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ It is the responsibility of the Commonwealth to	<
17	assist low-income households in meeting AND REDUCING their home	<
18	energy needs.	
19	(4) (5) The Commonwealth recognizes that Oil Overcharge	<
20	Funds are a temporary and inadequate method of supplementing the	
21	Federal Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program.	
22	(5) (6) The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program can	<
23	operate effectively only with a commitment of State dollars and	
24	resources to go along with the Federal dollars.	
25	(6) (7) The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program is not	<
26	an income maintenance program and should not be administered as	
27	such.	
28	(7) (8) The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program is of	<
29	such importance to the low-income households of this

1 dedicated exclusively to that purpose operated on a year-round 2 basis. 3 (b) There is hereby established within the Department of 4 Public Welfare, the Office of Low-Income Home Energy Assistance. 5 This office shall be separate and apart from offices performing other functions, and its sole function shall be the 6 administration of the ENERGY ASSISTANCE COMPONENTS OF THE Low-7 <-8 Income Home Energy Assistance Program in this Commonwealth. Its members shall be appointed 20 by the Secretary of Public Welfare to serve such term as he 21 deems necessary. 22 (d) (E) The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program shall <-23 be in operation for twelve months of the year. A quarterly 24 evaluation of the program shall be conducted the last day of 25 each fiscal quarter and benefits may be adjusted quarterly in 26 response to the evaluation. The council shall submit the 27 evaluation results to the General Assembly annually in the form 28 of <u>a report.</u> (e) (F) The Department of Public Welfare shall be 29 <----30 responsible for assuring that the departmental office and local
