AN ACT

Providing for the prevention, detection, treatment and follow-up
of cases of hepatitis B among firefighters, paramedics,
emergency medical technicians, ambulance attendants, first
responders and health professionals; and making an
appropriation.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

7 hereby enacts as follows:

8 Section 1. Statewide program.

9 In accordance with adopted standards consistent with accepted public health practice and the recommendations of the Centers 10 for Disease Control, the Department of Health shall establish a 11 12 Statewide program for the prevention, including inoculations, 13 screening, diagnosis, treatment, and medical and environmental follow-up, of cases of hepatitis B for firefighters, paramedics, 14 emergency medical technicians, ambulance attendants, first 15 responders and health professionals. A summary of the Statewide 16 program shall be made public. 17

1 Section 2. Eligible persons.

Every firefighter, paramedic, emergency medical technician, ambulance attendant, first responder and health professional within this Commonwealth determined to be at risk for hepatitis B according to standards for the Statewide program adopted by the Department of Health shall be eligible for service under this act.

Section 3. Powers and duties of Department of Health. 8 9 The Department of Health shall provide financial support to 10 State, district, county or local governmental or private 11 agencies, which agree to provide screening, diagnostic, treatment, educational and follow-up services as required under 12 13 the standards established for the Statewide program, for the 14 establishment of local hepatitis B detection, treatment or 15 prevention projects.

16 Section 4. Annual report.

The Department of Health shall publish an annual report which shall include, as a minimum, the number of firefighters, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, ambulance attendants, first responders and health professionals, as defined in the act of July 3, 1985 (P.L.164, No.45), known as the Emergency Medical Services Act, found to have hepatitis B.

23 Section 5. Immunity.

No person shall be liable for civil damages as a result of an act, or the omission of an act, committed while rendering services in good faith and in accordance with the provisions of this act.

28 Section 6. Appropriation.

29 The sum of \$3,500,000 is hereby appropriated to the 30 Department of Health for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 19910H0984B1111 - 2 -

- 1 30, 1992, to carry out the provisions of this act.
- 2 Section 7. Effective date.
