AN ACT

Making an appropriation to The Pennsylvania State University for the purpose of studying crop diversification and marketing potential.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. The following sums for the fiscal periods
indicated are hereby appropriated to the College of Agriculture of The Pennsylvania State University for the purposes set forth in section 2 :
(1) The sum of $\$ 125,000$, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992.
(2) The sum of $\$ 125,000$, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993.
(3) The sum of $\$ 100,000$, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the fiscal year July 1, 1993, to June 30, 1994.

Section 2. The appropriations made by this act are for the following purposes:
(1) To study the feasibility of introducing into this Commonwealth new species or varieties of crops or animals raised for food, based on environmental requirements, economic factors and demographic trends.
(2) To study the potential for product development and domestic and international market development for any such new crops or food animals as may be determined to be viable within this Commonwealth.
(3) To report to the Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committees of both the Senate and the House of Representatives by July 1, 1994, the result of all findings made under this act.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1991, or immediately, whichever is later.
