AN ACT

Requiring a transfer from the Realty Transfer Tax Account in the
General Fund to the Deferred Maintenance Account; and making
an appropriation.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Transfer of funds.

7 Effective for fiscal years beginning with 1993-1994, 10% of

8 the cash from the Realty Transfer Tax Account in the General

9 Fund shall be transferred to a restricted receipt account in the

10 State Treasury, known as the Deferred Maintenance Account, to be

11 used for deferred maintenance projects at State parks,

12 historical sites and museums owned by the Pennsylvania

13 Historical and Museum Commission and educational facilities

14 owned by the State System of Higher Education. The transfer from

15 the Realty Transfer Tax Account in the General Fund to the

16 Deferred Maintenance Account required by this section shall be

made on the last day of each month for the current month
beginning with the transfer on July 31, 1993.

3 Section 2. Report.

4 Beginning on January 31, 1993, and annually thereafter, the 5 Department of Environmental Resources, the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission and the State System of Higher 6 Education shall submit to the Governor and the majority chairman 7 and the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the 8 Senate and the majority chairman and the minority chairman of 9 10 the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives a 11 report of maintenance projects at State parks, historical sites and museums and educational facilities, respectively, which have 12 been deferred together with a proposed schedule for performing 13 14 deferred maintenance projects and an estimate of the cost of 15 each deferred maintenance project.

16 Section 3. Appropriation.

Effective for fiscal years beginning with 1993-1994, the General Assembly shall appropriate money from the Deferred Maintenance Account for deferred maintenance projects at State parks, historical sites and museums owned by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission and educational facilities owned by the State System of Higher Education.

23 Section 4. Effective date.

24 This act shall take effect July 1, 1993.
