A RESOLUTION

1 Proclaiming June 12, 1992, as "Anne Frank Day" in this
2 Commonwealth.

3 WHEREAS, There is an exacerbation of anti-Semitism, racial
4 and interethnic intolerance and the scapegoating of the ills of
5 society upon minorities; and

6 WHEREAS, The story of Anne Frank and the words of her diary
7 educate all of us, particularly the young, to the dangers of
8 intolerance, hate and discrimination; and

9 WHEREAS, The Diary of Anne Frank, the entries of a Jewish
10 teenage girl forced into hiding from the Nazi occupiers of
11 Holland, is a message of hope and faith in common humanity, a
12 message of the responsibility of ordinary people to aid all
13 those who are oppressed; and

14 WHEREAS, This teenager's short life conveys a message needed
15 today to strengthen people who strive to create and maintain a

1 just and humanitarian world; and

2 WHEREAS, The legacy of Anne Frank consists of the belief in
3 tolerance, political and religious pluralism and human rights;
4 and

5 WHEREAS, Anne Frank was born June 12, 1929; therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives proclaim June 12,
7 1992, as "Anne Frank Day" in this Commonwealth in recognition of
8 her example of the triumph of the human spirit.
