- 7 1945 (P.L.991, NO.385), KNOWN AS THE "URBAN REDEVELOPMENT LAW,"
- 8 A PARKING AUTHORITY PURSUANT TO THE ACT OF JUNE 5, 1947
- 9 (P.L.458, NO.208), KNOWN AS THE "PARKING AUTHORITY LAW," A PORT
- 10 AUTHORITY PURSUANT TO THE ACT OF DECEMBER 6, 1972 (P.L.1392,

- 17 MEDICAL SERVICE CORPORATION NOT FOR PROFIT, TO A HOUSING
- 18 CORPORATION NOT FOR PROFIT, TO THE COMMONWEALTH OR TO THE
- 19 FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. WHEN REAL PROPERTY IS TO BE SOLD TO A
- 20 CORPORATION NOT FOR PROFIT ORGANIZED AS A PUBLIC LIBRARY FOR ITS
- 21 EXCLUSIVE USE AS A LIBRARY OR TO A MEDICAL SERVICE CORPORATION
- 22 NOT FOR PROFIT OR TO A HOUSING CORPORATION NOT FOR PROFIT,
- 23 COUNCIL MAY ELECT TO ACCEPT A NOMINAL CONSIDERATION FOR THE SALE
- 24 AS IT SHALL DEEM APPROPRIATE. REAL PROPERTY SOLD PURSUANT TO
- 25 THIS SECTION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE CONDITION THAT WHEN THE
- 26 PROPERTY IS NOT USED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE CONVEYANCE, THE
- 27 PROPERTY SHALL REVERT TO THE CITY.
- 28 SECTION 2. THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ:
- 29 <u>Section 2101.1. Designation DEMOTION of Fire Chief and</u>
- 30 <u>Deputy Fire Chief.--The fire chief and deputy fire chief shall <--</u>

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- 1 be designated by the mayor and may be demoted without cause in
- 2 the same manner, but not to any rank lower than the rank which
- 3 he held at the time of his designation as fire chief or deputy
- 4 fire chief.
- 5 Section 2. Section 2102 of the act, amended November 9, 1965 <
- 6 (P.L.670, No.328), is amended to read:
- 7 Section 2102. Paid Bureau; Election of Officers and
- 8 Companies. When a paid fire bureau is organized by any city,
- 9 the council may provide, by ordinance, for the election or
- 10 appointment of the officers and companies belonging thereto, in
- 11 accordance with civil service provisions where applicable, with
- 12 <u>the exception of designation of the fire chief and deputy fire</u>
- 13 chief, which shall be performed by the mayor. The minimum annual
- 14 starting salary or compensation to be paid the officers and
- 15 firemen by any city shall be four thousand five hundred dollars
- 16 (\$4,500), with minimum annual increments of three hundred
- 17 dollars (\$300) for the first three years of such employment. If
- 18 the annual salary or compensation of any fireman employed by the
- 19 city on the effective date of this amending act is less than
- 20 four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500), such salary or
- 21 compensation shall be increased to four thousand five hundred
- 22 dollars (\$4,500), and such fireman shall receive minimum annual
- 23 increments of three hundred dollars (\$300) for the next three
- 24 years of such employment.
- 25 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
