## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of July 8, 1986 (P.L.437, No.92), entitled "An act providing for grants to agricultural societies and associations to develop and improve agricultural fairs; establishing an advisory committee in the Department of Agriculture; and making repeals," granting certain regulatory authority to the State Harness Racing Commission.

9	Section 1. Section 5 of the THE act of July 8, 1986	<
L O	(P.L.437, No.92), known as the Pennsylvania Agricultural Fair	
L1	Act, is amended BY ADDING A SECTION to read:	<
L2	Section 5. Grants.	<
L3	(a) Award of grants. The department is authorized to make	
L 4	grants in amounts approved by the secretary in the following	
L5	manner:	
L6	(1) On or before February 1, annually, to eligible	
L7	county agricultural societies, independent agricultural	
L8	societies and other organizations which conduct an annual	
L9	agricultural fair to assist the organizations as follows:	

1 (i) Financing their operating costs, including, but not limited to, the cost of exhibiting agribusiness 2. 3 products, materials and equipment, conducting 4 agricultural or agribusiness educational activities and demonstrations, and awarding premiums to contest and 5 exhibit winners at the fairs. 6 (A) A basic payment for operating expenses, 7 the sum of which may not exceed \$14,000 for Class 8 A fairs, \$12,000 for Class B fairs, \$9,500 for 9 Class C fairs, \$7,000 for Class D fairs and 10 11 \$2,500 for Class E fairs. 12 (B) Fifty percent of money paid for all 13 other agricultural premiums not included in 14 paragraph (1), with a maximum payment for 15 premiums not to exceed \$15,000. 16 (ii) Financing their costs to improve buildings and 17 grounds, add land or construct new facilities. 18 (iii) Reimbursing each county agricultural society 19 and each independent agricultural society conducting 20 harness horse racing during its annual fair, other than 21 races for two and three year old colts and fillies 22 provided for in subparagraph (iv), in an amount of money 23 equal to that used during its annual fair as purse money 2.4 for harness horse racing, track and stable maintenance, 25 starting gate rental and the cost of all harness horse 26 racing officials required during the annual fair. 27 Reimbursement shall not exceed \$13,000, and a minimum of 28 \$4,000 shall be used for purse money. 29 (iv) Reimbursing each county agricultural society

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and independent agricultural society conducting races for

1 two and three year old colts and fillies at its annual fair, concerning which a maximum of \$7,600 was paid 2. 3 annually. Entrance fees collected for each race shall not 4 be included for purposes of determining eligibility for a 5 grant under this section. (2) To Statewide agricultural organizations which 6 7

- contribute to the development of many phases of agriculture or agribusiness.
- (3) To countywide or Statewide 4 H and FFA or combined FFA and FHA units of boys and girls under 21 years of age to be used for the general operations of the units in agriculture or agribusiness programs. An organization whose members consist entirely of minors must apply through and be represented by an adult advisory group, and both groups must be recognized by their respective county governments or by the Commonwealth. Each countywide or Statewide 4 H and FFA or combined FFA and FHA unit shall be required to report on its activities and justify these activities as events which contribute to the advancement of agriculture or agribusiness. Reports shall include a record of expenses incurred in the conduct of these qualifying activities. The grant awarded to each youth group cannot exceed the amount of expenses reported for the conduct of the activities.
- 2.4 (b) Regulations. The State Harness Racing Commission shall
- 25 have jurisdiction over and shall promulgate regulations as
- necessary for the proper administration of all racing provided 26
- 27 under this section.
- 28 SECTION 8.1. AUTHORITY TO REGULATE RACING CONDUCTED AT
- 29 AGRICULTURAL FAIRS.
- PURSUANT TO THE ACT OF DECEMBER 17, 1981 (P.L.435, NO.135), 30

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- 1 KNOWN AS THE RACE HORSE INDUSTRY REFORM ACT, THE STATE HARNESS
- 2 RACING COMMISSION SHALL HAVE JURISDICTION OVER AND SHALL
- 3 PROMULGATE REGULATIONS AS NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER
- 4 ADMINISTRATION OF ALL RACING CONDUCTED AT AN AGRICULTURAL FAIR
- 5 BY A COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY OR AN INDEPENDENT AGRICULTURAL
- 6 SOCIETY.
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
