AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for when a child has
- 3 resided with grandparents.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 5313 of Title 23 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 5313. When child has resided with grandparents.
- 9 (a) Partial custody and visitation. -- If an unmarried child
- 10 has resided with his grandparents or great-grandparents for a
- 11 period of 12 months or more and is subsequently removed from the
- 12 home by his parents, the grandparents or great-grandparents may
- 13 petition the court for an order granting them reasonable partial
- 14 custody or visitation rights, or both, to the child. The court
- 15 shall grant the petition if it finds that visitation rights
- 16 would be in the best interest of the child and would not
- 17 interfere with the parent-child relationship.

- 1 (b) Sole custody.--A grandparent has standing to bring a
- 2 petition for sole legal and physical custody of a child. If it
- 3 is in the best interest of the child to not be in the custody of
- 4 <u>either parent</u>, the court may award sole legal custody and sole
- 5 physical custody to the grandparent. This subsection applies to
- 6 <u>a grandparent:</u>
- 7 (1) who has genuine care and concern for the child;
- 8 (2) whose relationship with the child began with the
- 9 <u>consent of a parent of the child or pursuant to an order of</u>
- 10 court;
- 11 (3) who, over an extended period of time, has assumed
- the role and responsibilities of the child's parent,
- providing for the physical, emotional, financial and social
- 14 needs of the child; and
- 15 (4) who deems it is necessary to assume the role and
- responsibilities of the child's parent due to physical or
- 17 sexual abuse or neglect or parental dysfunction, including,
- 18 but not limited to, drug or alcohol abuse and emotional or

- 19 mental illness or instability.
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
