## AN ACT

Amending the act of July 3, 1986 (P.L.388, No.84), entitled "An act requiring public agencies to hold certain meetings and hearings open to the public; and providing penalties," further providing for jurisdiction and venue of judicial proceedings.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Section 15 of the act of July 3, 1986 (P.L.388,
No. 84), known as the Sunshine Act, is amended to read:
Section 15. Jurisdiction and venue of judicial proceedings.
The Commonwealth Court shall have original jurisdiction of actions involving state agencies and [the courts of common pleas] district justices shall have original jurisdiction of actions involving other agencies to [render declaratory judgments or to] enforce this act[r]. The courts of common pleas shall have appellate jurisdiction involving other agencies to render judgments or to further enforce this act, by injunction
or other remedy deemed appropriate by the court. The action may be brought by any person where the agency whose act is complained of is located or where the act complained of occurred.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
