- AN ACT Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 1 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for registration of habitual 3 sexual offenders of children; and imposing a penalty. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. - 13 9302. Duty to register.
- 14 9303. Discharge of habitual sexual offender of children from

- 2 9306. Duration of registration.
- 3 9307. Registration requirements.
- 4 9308. Public inspection of registration data prohibited.
- 5 9309. Penalty.
- 6 § 9301. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 8 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 "Habitual sexual offender of children." A person who is
- 11 convicted for a second or subsequent time of an offense
- 12 enumerated in Chapter 31 (relating to sexual offenses) or
- 13 section 6312 (relating to sexual abuse of children) if the
- 14 victim is 17 years of age or younger.
- 15 (1) A conviction of attempt to commit an offense defined
- in this section shall constitute a conviction for the
- 17 purposes of this chapter.
- 18 (2) Convictions which result from or are connected with
- 19 the same act or result from offenses committed at the same
- time shall be counted as one conviction.
- 21 (3) A conviction set aside under law is not a conviction
- for the purposes of this chapter.
- 23 (4) A conviction of an offense under the law of another
- state which is substantially equivalent to an offense
- 25 enumerated in Chapter 31 or section 6312 shall constitute a
- 26 conviction for the purpose of this chapter.
- 27 § 9302. Duty to register.
- 28 A habitual sexual offender of children shall, within 30 days
- 29 of his coming into any county in which he resides or is
- 30 temporarily domiciled for more than 30 days, register with the

- 1 chief of police of the jurisdiction in which he resides or, in
- 2 the event there is no chief of police, with the Pennsylvania
- 3 State Police.
- 4 § 9303. Discharge of habitual sexual offender of children from
- 5 penal institution.
- 6 A habitual sexual offender of children who is discharged or
- 7 paroled from a prison, hospital or other institution or facility
- 8 where he was confined because of a conviction of one of the
- 9 offenses defined in section 9301 (relating to definitions)
- 10 shall, prior to discharge, parole or release, be informed of his
- 11 duty to register under this chapter by the institution or
- 12 facility in which he was confined. The institution or facility
- 13 shall require the person to read and sign a form prepared by the
- 14 Pennsylvania State Police stating that the duty to register and
- 15 the procedure for registration have been explained to him. The
- 16 institution or facility shall obtain the address where the
- 17 person expects to reside upon his discharge, parole or release
- 18 and shall report the address to the Pennsylvania State Police.
- 19 The institution or facility shall give one copy of the form to
- 20 the person and shall send two copies to the Pennsylvania State
- 21 Police who shall forward one copy to the chief of police of the
- 22 jurisdiction where the person expects to reside upon his
- 23 discharge, parole or release. The parole officer of a habitual
- 24 sexual offender shall notify the chief of police of the
- 25 jurisdiction where the parolee offender resides of parolee's
- 26 residence and place of employment on an annual basis.
- 27 § 9304. Duties of court.
- 28 (a) Upon conviction. -- Upon conviction of an offense defined
- 29 in section 9301 (relating to definitions), the court shall
- 30 certify that the person is a habitual sexual offender of

- 1 children and shall include the certification in the order of
- 2 commitment.
- 3 (b) Upon release. -- A habitual sexual offender of children
- 4 who is released on probation or discharged upon payment of a
- 5 fine because of the commission of, or attempt to commit, one of
- 6 the offenses defined in section 9301 shall, prior to release, be
- 7 informed of his duty to register under this chapter by the court
- 8 in which he was convicted. The court shall require the person to
- 9 read and sign a form prepared by the Pennsylvania State Police
- 10 stating that the duty to register and the procedure for
- 11 registration have been explained to him. The court shall obtain
- 12 the address where the person expects to reside upon his release
- 13 and shall report the address to the Pennsylvania State Police.
- 14 The court shall give one copy of the form to the person and
- 15 shall send two copies to the Pennsylvania State Police who shall
- 16 forward one copy to the chief of police of the jurisdiction
- 17 where the person expects to reside upon his release.
- 18 § 9305. Change of address.
- 19 If any person required to register under this chapter changes
- 20 his residence address, he shall inform the chief of police of
- 21 the jurisdiction with whom he last registered of his new
- 22 address, in writing, within ten days. The chief of police of the
- 23 jurisdiction shall, within three days of receipt, forward the
- 24 information to the Pennsylvania State Police and to the chief of
- 25 police of the jurisdiction of the new place of residence.
- 26 § 9306. Duration of registration.
- 27 A person required to register under this chapter shall be
- 28 required to register for a period of twenty-five years after
- 29 conviction, if not confined to a penal institution, hospital or
- 30 any other institution or facility. If so confined, the person

- 1 shall be required to register for a period of twenty-five years
- 2 after parole, discharge or release from the facility. Liability
- 3 for registration terminates only if the person does not during
- 4 the applicable ten-year period again become liable to register
- 5 under the provisions of this chapter.
- 6 § 9307. Registration requirements.
- 7 Registration under this chapter shall consist of a statement
- 8 in writing signed by the registrant giving information as may be
- 9 required by the Pennsylvania State Police, which may include the
- 10 fingerprints and photograph of the applicant. Within three days
- 11 the registering chief of police of the jurisdiction shall
- 12 forward the statement and any other required information to the
- 13 Pennsylvania State Police.
- 14 § 9308. Public inspection of registration data permitted.
- 15 The statements or any other information required by this
- 16 chapter shall be open to inspection by the public.
- 17 § 9309. Penalty.
- 18 A person required to register under this chapter who violates
- 19 any of its provisions commits a misdemeanor of the second
- 20 degree.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
