A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating May as "Neurofibromatosis Awareness Month."
- WHEREAS, Neurofibromatosis (NF) is the most common
- 3 neurological disorder caused by a single gene, one baby in 3,000
- 4 being born with NF each year and 100,000 Americans of both sexes
- 5 and all national origins and races are being affected with this
- 6 disorder; and
- WHEREAS, NF is characterized by the presence of multiple skin
- 8 lesions and includes various orthopedic, opthalmic and
- 9 neurologic disabilities and a very high rate of learning
- 10 disabilities; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In July of 1990, identification of the NF1 gene was
- 12 announced at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., a
- 13 stunning development which gives hope to development of
- 14 diagnostic testing and has far-reaching implications to genetic
- 15 research in general, as well as ways a number of cancers
- 16 develop; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Although the race to find the cure has begun, until

- 1 a treatment and cure are found, the public needs to be educated
- 2 about this debilitating disorder; therefore be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 4 month of May, 1993, as "Neurofibromatosis Awareness Month" in
- 5 Pennsylvania.
