A RESOLUTION

- 1 Requesting the Department of Transportation to conduct a review
- of the ramp design, signage and highway alignment at the
- 3 intersection ramps of I-76 and I-476 in West Conshohocken
- 4 Borough.
- 5 WHEREAS, There have been at least six major tractor-trailer
- 6 accidents at the ramps connecting the Schuylkill Expressway (I-
- 7 76) to the Blue Route (I-476) in West Conshohocken Borough since
- 8 December 1991; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Fire company officials and truck owners are
- 10 concerned that the ramp designs may not be sufficient to ensure
- 11 the safety of motorists at the intersection of I-76 and I-476;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Five accidents took place on the ramp connecting I-
- 14 76 to I-476 southbound; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Two accidents on the ramps to I-476 resulted in the
- 16 death of the drivers; and
- 17 WHEREAS, According to figures supplied by the Delaware Valley
- 18 Regional Planning Commission, between 800 and 1,000 heavy trucks

- 1 are among the 10,900 vehicles daily using the eastbound I-76
- 2 ramp, compared to between 370 and 500 heavy trucks per day on
- 3 the westbound ramp; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The most recent accident required a 17-hour cleanup
- 5 of a hazardous materials spill by 150 firefighters and police.
- 6 This caused the ramp to be closed for the entire morning rush
- 7 hour; and
- 8 WHEREAS, One accident involved an 8,500-gallon gasoline
- 9 tanker and led to an explosion that killed the driver, closed I-
- 10 76, threatened the structural integrity of the ramp and caused
- 11 gridlock on local roads; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Officials in West Conshohocken say a preponderance
- 13 of emergency calls within the borough is attributable to
- 14 accidents and incidents on these two State highways; and
- WHEREAS, Safe roads must be a priority in this Commonwealth,
- 16 and travelers, truckers and local residents and communities may
- 17 have been put at very dangerous risk by engineering at this
- 18 interchange; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Recent accidents have caused damage to the ramps
- 20 estimated at \$175,000; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the Department of Transportation conduct an
- 22 immediate and thorough review of the ramp design, signage and
- 23 highway alignment at northbound and southbound ramps from I-76
- 24 onto I-476. Results of this report shall be made available to
- 25 members of the General Assembly.
