AN ACT

Providing for agricultural education programs; AND imposing duties on the Department of Education. ; and creating the 3 Advisory Council on Agricultural Education. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Short title. 6 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Agricultural Education Act. Section 2. Declaration of policy. 10 The General Assembly declares it is the purpose of this act 11 to: 12 Require the Department of Education to develop and 13 disseminate agricultural education materials for the educational systems of this Commonwealth SCHOOL ENTITIES OR 14 15 PRIVATE OR NONPUBLIC KINDERGARTENS, ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY

SCHOOLS IN THIS COMMONWEALTH. The materials shall incorporate

- 1 agricultural concepts into the basic school curricula and
- 2 shall be designed to educate the general student population
- about the importance of the agriculture industry and the role
- 4 of agriculture in the students' lives.
- 5 (2) Encourage the agricultural education efforts of
- 6 other agencies where appropriate, including, but not limited
- 7 to, those of the county conservation districts, the
- 8 Cooperative Extension Service of the Pennsylvania State
- 9 University, the University of Pennsylvania Veterinary School,
- 10 the Department of Agriculture, the Department of
- 11 Environmental Resources, the Department of Community Affairs,
- 12 the State System of Higher Education and the Department of
- 13 Transportation.
- 14 (3) Create and establish the Advisory Council on
- 15 Agricultural Education within the Department of Education.
- 16 Section 3. Definitions.
- 17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 18 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 20 "Council." The Advisory Council on Agricultural Education
- 21 established under this act.
- 22 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 23 Commonwealth.
- 24 "Farmer." Any person who engages in the accepted activities,
- 25 practices and procedures year after year to produce and prepare
- 26 for market poultry, livestock and their products or in the
- 27 production and harvesting of agricultural, agronomic,
- 28 horticultural, silvicultural and aquacultural crops and
- 29 commodities and whose operation is conducted on not less than
- 30 ten contiguous acres in area or, if less than ten contiguous

- 1 acres in area, has an anticipated yearly gross income of at
- 2 least \$10,000.
- 3 "SCHOOL ENTITY." A PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT, INTERMEDIATE UNIT <---
- 4 OR AREA VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL SCHOOL.
- 5 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 6 Section 4. Powers and duties of department.
- 7 The department shall have the power and its duty shall be to:
- 8 (1) Provide assistance, support and resource information <-
- 9 to educators and public and private education agencies <-

- 10 SCHOOLS and organizations on agricultural education.
- 11 (2) Provide for distribution to educational systems <--
- 12 SCHOOL ENTITIES OR PRIVATE OR NONPUBLIC KINDERGARTENS,
- 13 ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN THIS COMMONWEALTH
- 14 materials on agricultural education. Such materials may
- include instruction on issues related to agriculture,
- including, but not limited to, food safety, pesticides,
- farmland preservation, waste management, wetlands, nutrient
- management, food production and food processing, animal
- 19 health and statutory and regulatory protections of the right
- 20 to farm.
- 21 (3) Identify, recognize and establish awards for
- 22 exemplary agricultural education curricula developed in
- 23 Commonwealth schools.
- 24 (4) Use the department's council and local school
- 25 district occupational advisory committees to serve as the
- 26 conduit to bring youth and adult education programs into
- 27 communities and schools, focusing on agricultural industry
- issues of importance to this Commonwealth.
- 29 Section 5. Agricultural education report.
- The secretary shall prepare and submit an annual report to

the Governor and the General Assembly outlining agricultural education programs and achievements, highlighting new initiatives and recommending future program needs. 3 4 Section 6. Advisory Council on Agricultural Education. **/**___ 5 (a) Duties. There is hereby created the Advisory Council on Agricultural Education within the Department of Education. The 6 council shall: 7 8 (1) Advise and assist the secretary in conducting a 9 continual assessment of the trends and needs in agricultural 10 education. 11 (2) Advise and assist the secretary in carrying out agricultural education activities. 12 13 (3) Make recommendations to the secretary with respect 14 to the use of any funds used to support agricultural 15 education activities. (4) Make recommendations to the secretary to help foster 16 17 agricultural education programs. 18 (b) Composition. The council shall consist of 13 members, as follows: 19 20 (1) The secretary, who shall serve as chairperson. 21 (2) The Secretary of Agriculture. 22 (3) Eleven members to be appointed by the secretary as 23 follows: 2.4 (i) Three Commonwealth residents representing the 25 food processing industry. 26 (ii) Three Commonwealth residents who are active in 27 the agricultural production industry, at least one of 28 which shall be a farmer.

4	teacher. In appointing this member, the secretary shall
5	consider nominees recommended by the Pennsylvania
6	Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association.
7	In appointing members representing the food processing,
8	commercial agricultural production and commercial
9	agricultural marketing industries, the secretary shall
L O	consider nominees from listings prepared and submitted by the
L1	Pennsylvania Council of Farm Organizations, the Agriculture
L2	Awareness Foundation and the public at large.
L3	(c) Appointments, terms and expenses. The terms of office
L4	for each of the 11 appointed council members shall be three
L 5	years. However, the initial appointment of members representing
L6	the food processing, agricultural production and agricultural
L7	marketing industries shall be as follows:
L8	(1) One member representing each industry shall be
L9	appointed for a term of one year.
20	(2) One member representing each industry shall be
21	appointed for a term of two years.
22	(3) One member representing each industry shall be
23	appointed for a term of three years.
24	A member may be appointed for more than one term and shall serve
25	until a successor has been appointed. Members shall not be
26	compensated but shall be reimbursed for actual expenses in
27	accordance with the rules of the executive board.
28	(d) Offices and bylaws. The council shall convene at least
29	annually, shall elect a vice chairperson to serve a one year
30	term and shall adopt bylaws for governing its operations.

- 1 (e) Staff. The secretary shall designate staff as may be
- 2 necessary for the operation of the council.
- 3 SECTION 6. DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.
- 4 (A) CONSULTATION. -- THE SECRETARY OF EDUCATION SHALL CONSULT,

- 5 AT LEAST ANNUALLY, WITH THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE AND A CROSS
- 6 SECTION OF THE AGRICULTURE AND EDUCATION COMMUNITIES TO:
- 7 (1) ASSESS THE TRENDS AND NEEDS IN AGRICULTURAL
- 8 EDUCATION.
- 9 (2) CONSIDER THE MANNER IN WHICH ANY FUNDS ARE USED TO
- 10 SUPPORT AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION ACTIVITIES.
- 11 (3) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE GENERAL
- 12 ASSEMBLY REGARDING LEGISLATIVE OR REGULATORY CHANGES TO
- 13 IMPROVE AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION, PURSUANT TO THE PREPARATION
- 14 AND SUBMITTAL OF THE REPORT REQUIRED BY SECTION 5.
- 15 (B) PARTICIPATING ORGANIZATIONS. -- WHEN CONSULTING WITH A
- 16 CROSS SECTION OF THE AGRICULTURE AND EDUCATION COMMUNITIES, THE
- 17 SECRETARY SHALL CONSIDER SEEKING COMMENTS FROM INDIVIDUALS NAMED
- 18 IN LISTS SUBMITTED BY THE STATE COUNCIL ON FARM ORGANIZATIONS,
- 19 THE AGRICULTURAL AWARENESS FOUNDATION AND THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 20 VOCATIONAL-AGRICULTURAL TEACHERS ASSOCIATION. SUCH LISTS MAY
- 21 INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO:
- 22 (1) FARMERS.
- 23 (2) REPRESENTATIVES OF THE AGRICULTURAL PROCESSING AND
- 24 AGRICULTURAL MARKETING INDUSTRIES.
- 25 (3) FACULTY MEMBERS OF THE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURAL
- 26 SCIENCES OF THE COMMONWEALTH'S LAND-GRANT UNIVERSITY.
- 27 (4) FACULTY MEMBERS FROM A STATE SYSTEM OF HIGHER
- 28 EDUCATION INSTITUTION, EACH OF WHOM SHALL HAVE BACKGROUND IN
- OR KNOWLEDGE OF AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.
- 30 (5) A TEACHER OF VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE.

- 1 (6) A TEACHER INVOLVED IN AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION OTHER
- 2 THAN VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE.
- 3 (7) AN ADMINISTRATOR OF A SCHOOL ENTITY WHICH CONDUCTS
- 4 AN AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION PROGRAM.
- 5 (8) A MEMBER OF A LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT OCCUPATIONAL
- 6 ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
- 7 (9) MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO ARE KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT
- AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION. 8
- 9 Section 7. Effective date.
- 10 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
