## AN ACT

Amending the act of December 14, 1992 (P.L.866, No.137), 1 2 entitled "An act authorizing certain counties to increase the 3 recording fees of deeds and mortgages to support or enhance local affordable housing efforts," extending the act to 5 counties of the first class. 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The definition of "county" in section 3 of the 8 act of December 14, 1992 (P.L.866, No.137), known as the 10 Optional County Affordable Housing Funds Act, is amended to 11 read: 12 Section 3. Definitions. 13 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 14 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 15 context clearly indicates otherwise: 16 17 "County." Any county of the first, second, second A, third,

fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh or eighth class. [The term does

not include any county of the first class.]

- 2 Section 4. Optional fee increases.
- 3 The county commissioners or the governing body of each
- 4 county, as defined in section 3, shall have the power and may by
- 5 ordinance increase the fees charged by the recorder of deeds for
- 6 recording deeds and mortgages under the act of June 12, 1919
- 7 (P.L.476, No.240), referred to as the Second Class County
- 8 Recorder of Deeds Fee Law, the act of April 20, 1949 (P.L.644,
- 9 No.143), entitled "An act to regulate and establish the fees to
- 10 be charged and collected by the recorders of deeds in counties
- 11 of the first class," and the act of April 8, 1982 (P.L.310,
- 12 No.87), referred to as the Recorder of Deeds Fee Law. The
- 13 additional fees levied by the county commissioners shall not
- 14 exceed 100% of the amounts charged on the effective date of this
- 15 act.
- 16 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
