## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Office of State Fire Commissioner as an
- 2 independent office; transferring the Volunteer Loan
- 3 Assistance Program and the State Fire Academy to the Office
- 4 of State Fire Commissioner; and making repeals.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Office of
- 9 State Fire Commissioner Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

- 1 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 2 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.
- 3 "Commissioner." The State Fire Commissioner appointed under
- 4 section 4.
- 5 "Committee." The Fire Safety Advisory Committee established
- 6 under section 7.
- 7 "Office." The Office of State Fire Commissioner established
- 8 under section 3.
- 9 Section 3. Establishment of Office of State Fire Commissioner.
- 10 The Office of State Fire Commissioner is hereby established
- 11 as an independent office.
- 12 Section 4. State Fire Commissioner.
- 13 (a) State Fire Commissioner. -- Within the office there shall
- 14 be the State Fire Commissioner, who shall report to the Governor
- 15 on all matters concerning fire safety in this Commonwealth. The
- 16 commissioner shall have the power and duty to:
- 17 (1) Coordinate the activities of State and local
- 18 community interests engaged in fire prevention and control
- 19 activities.
- 20 (2) Serve as a focal point for information relative to
- 21 fires, property damage, injuries and the loss of life.
- 22 (3) Disseminate, through periodic reports, information
- about fire prevention efforts and fire control techniques.
- 24 (4) Develop and participate in a program of public
- information and education designed to create a public
- 26 awareness of the incidence and the ravages of fire and
- 27 methods the individual can take to prevent fires and minimize
- loss when they occur.
- 29 (5) Serve as a central point to support local efforts
- 30 and interests in all matters pertinent to fire prevention and

- 1 control.
- 2 (b) Transfer. -- The office shall use, employ and expend in
- 3 connection with the functions, powers and duties in subsection
- 4 (a) for the position of the commissioner contract obligations,
- 5 if any, records, files, property, supplies and equipment now
- 6 being used or held in connection with such functions, powers and
- 7 duties and the unexpended balance of appropriations,
- 8 allocations, Federal grants and other funds available or to be
- 9 made available for use in connection with such functions, powers
- 10 and duties as previously transmitted to the agency by
- 11 Reorganization Plan No.5 of 1981 (P.L.612).
- 12 (c) Qualifications and appointment.--The commissioner shall
- 13 be a person who, by reason of training, experience and
- 14 attainment, is qualified to coordinate fire prevention and
- 15 control activities. The commissioner shall be appointed by the
- 16 Governor after consultation with the fire service community AND
- 17 WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED
- 18 TO THE SENATE. The commissioner also shall report to the
- 19 Lieutenant Governor on all matters related to the office and
- 20 shall act as the Commonwealth's primary representative with the
- 21 Statewide fire service community.
- 22 Section 5. Pennsylvania State Fire Academy.
- 23 (a) Creation. -- There is hereby created within the office the
- 24 Pennsylvania State Fire Academy, which shall be under the
- 25 operational control of the commissioner. The agency shall
- 26 administratively provide for the erection or construction, the
- 27 furnishing, the staffing and the equipping of the buildings and
- 28 structures through the Department of General Services and the
- 29 leasing thereof by the Commonwealth for the use and support of
- 30 the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy.

- 1 (b) Transfer.--There are hereby transferred to the office,
- 2 to be used, employed and expended in connection with the
- 3 functions, powers and duties authorized in subsection (a),
- 4 personnel, contract obligations, if any, records, files,
- 5 property, supplies and equipment now being used or held in
- 6 connection with such functions, powers and duties and the
- 7 unexpended balance of appropriations, allocations, Federal
- 8 grants and other funds available or to be made available for use
- 9 in connection with such functions, powers and duties as
- 10 previously transmitted to the agency by Reorganization Plan No.6
- 11 of 1981 (P.L.613).
- 12 (c) Hazardous chemical and radioactive material training.--
- 13 The Pennsylvania State Fire Academy shall serve as the resident
- 14 Commonwealth government center for hazardous chemical and
- 15 radioactive material training. The Pennsylvania State Fire
- 16 Academy is authorized to use resident and field staff to support
- 17 this training.
- 18 (d) Firefighter training and certification.--A Statewide
- 19 firefighter training program shall be implemented by the
- 20 commissioner to educate the fire service community about the
- 21 importance of firefighter health and safety. This program shall
- 22 include measures designed to increase the mobility of training
- 23 courses throughout this Commonwealth, to enhance firefighter
- 24 accessibility to training course offerings and to improve and
- 25 expand training for and response capability to emergencies, with
- 26 emphasis on hazardous materials incidents. The program shall
- 27 also include implementation of a firefighter certification
- 28 program in accordance with parameters developed by the
- 29 commissioner, consistent with established standards. The
- 30 acquisition of physical resources to enhance Statewide

- 1 capability shall be coordinated by the commissioner.
- 2 Section 6. Pennsylvania Volunteer Loan Assistance Program.
- 3 (a) Creation.--Within the office there shall be a loan
- 4 assistance program, which shall be implemented by the
- 5 commissioner, for volunteer agencies, known as the Pennsylvania
- 6 Volunteer Loan Assistance Program, which shall make loans to
- 7 volunteer fire companies, volunteer ambulance services,
- 8 hazardous materials units and volunteer rescue squads for the
- 9 purpose of establishing or modernizing facilities to house
- 10 firefighting apparatus equipment, ambulances and rescue vehicles
- 11 and for purchasing new firefighting apparatus equipment,
- 12 ambulances, rescue vehicles and protective and communications
- 13 equipment and any other accessory equipment necessary for the
- 14 proper performance of such organizations' duties, as recognized
- 15 by the community.
- 16 (b) Transfer.--There are hereby transferred to the office,
- 17 to be used, employed and expended in connection with the
- 18 functions, powers and duties authorized in subsection (a),
- 19 personnel, contractual obligations, if any, mortgages, liens,
- 20 encumbrances and any other secured interests, records, files,
- 21 property, supplies and equipment now being used or held in
- 22 connection with such functions, power and duties and the
- 23 expended UNEXPENDED balance of appropriations, allocations and
- 24 other funds available or to be made available for use in
- 25 connection with such functions, powers and duties as previously
- 26 transmitted to the agency by Reorganization Plan No.7 of 1981
- 27 (P.L.615).
- 28 (C) REGULATIONS.--THE VOLUNTEER LOAN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
- 29 REGULATIONS FOUND IN 4 PA. CODE CH. 113 (RELATING TO VOLUNTEER
- 30 FIRE COMPANY, AMBULANCE SERVICE AND RESCUE SQUAD ASSISTANCE) ARE

- 1 HEREBY TRANSFERRED TO THE OFFICE FROM THE AGENCY. THE OFFICE MAY
- 2 FULLY IMPLEMENT AND ADMINISTER THOSE REGULATIONS ON THE
- 3 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT. THE NAME OF THE OFFICE MAY BE
- 4 SUBSTITUTED FOR THE AGENCY THROUGHOUT THE REGULATIONS AND THE
- 5 REGULATIONS MAY BE RENUMBERED AND PUBLISHED IN THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 6 BULLETIN AS A FINAL REGULATION WITHOUT THOSE REGULATORY CHANGES
- 7 BEING SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT OF JUNE 25, 1982
- 8 (P.L.633, NO.181), KNOWN AS THE REGULATORY REVIEW ACT.
- 9 Section 7. Fire Safety Advisory Committee.
- 10 (a) Creation. -- There is hereby created the Fire Safety
- 11 Advisory Committee to assist the commissioner. The committee
- 12 shall consist of nine members, as follows:
- 13 (1) The director of the agency, ex officio.
- 14 (2) The commissioner, who shall serve as chairman.
- 15 (3) Two paid firefighters.
- 16 (4) One member of the public, to be appointed by the
- 17 Governor.
- 18 (5) Four volunteer firefighters, one each to be
- 19 appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate, the
- 20 Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
- 21 Representatives and the Minority Leader of the House of
- 22 Representatives.
- 23 Members of the committee shall serve at the pleasure of their
- 24 appointing authority. The committee shall advise the
- 25 commissioner on matters pertaining to the operation of the
- 26 Pennsylvania State Fire Academy and any other matters as the
- 27 commissioner may request.
- 28 (b) Expenses.--Members of the committee shall receive
- 29 reimbursement for reasonable traveling, hotel and other
- 30 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties

- 1 in accordance with Commonwealth regulations.
- 2 Section 8. Appropriations.
- 3 All appropriations for the commissioner shall be by a
- 4 separate line item in the General Appropriation Act.
- 5 Section 9. Repeals.
- 6 The provisions of 35 Pa.C.S. §§ 7315, 7316, 7317, 7318 and
- 7 7319 are repealed.
- 8 Section 10. Effective date.
- 9 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
