A RESOLUTION

1 Memorializing Congress to study certain matters relating to the
2 European Common Market.

3 WHEREAS, Certain questions have arisen relating to the
4 potential restraint of trade posed by European Common Market
5 regulations; therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the
7 Congress of the United States to study the following:

8 (1) Whether or not European Common Market safety codes
9 pose a potential restraint of trade by requiring unrealistic
10 standards for products imported into the European Market.

11 (2) Whether or not similar restrictions should be placed
12 upon European imports into this country;

13 and be it further

14 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
15 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each
16 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
