A RESOLUTION

Directing the Finance Committee of the House of Representatives 1 to develop a local tax reform plan that reduces reliance on 2 3 property taxes to finance local school districts. 4 WHEREAS, The ever-increasing revenue expenditures of local 5 school districts have placed a growing burden on local б taxpayers; and 7 WHEREAS, That tax burden is met through the levying of real 8 property taxes as a result of a limitation on the rate of earned 9 income taxes which may be levied by a school district; and 10 WHEREAS, Real property taxes place an unfair burden on those 11 persons living on fixed incomes or who are temporarily 12 unemployed or are young families just starting out; and 13 WHEREAS, That burden often results in senior citizens having to leave the home that they worked a lifetime to afford; 14 therefore be it 15 16 RESOLVED, That the Finance Committee of the House of

Representatives shall review the local tax reform proposals that
 have been presented in recent years as well as during the
 current session; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Finance Committee of the House of
Representatives shall develop legislation to reduce reliance on
real property taxes to finance local school districts; and be it
further

8 RESOLVED, That the Finance Committee of the House of 9 Representatives review and consider alternative sources of 10 revenue, such as sales taxes, personal income taxes and other 11 taxes when developing legislation to effectuate a reduction in 12 real property taxes; and be it further

13 RESOLVED, That the Finance Committee of the House of 14 Representatives' proposed legislation ensures that businesses 15 continue to pay their fair share of support to the local school 16 district system; and be it further

17 RESOLVED, That the Finance Committee present to the House of 18 Representatives its plan within 180 days of the adoption of this 19 resolution.
