A RESOLUTION

- 1 Directing the Local Government Commission to determine the
- 2 feasibility of implementing a centralized records system on a
- 3 county level.
- 4 WHEREAS, Statistics have shown that crime in this
- 5 Commonwealth from the period 1973 to 1993 increased 27%; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Violent crimes during that same period increased
- 7 52%; and
- 8 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has 1,205 local police departments
- 9 across the State; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The number of full-time police officers over that
- 11 two-decade span decreased by 1,361; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Local governments have struggled to continue to fund
- 13 police services for their communities and often have to reduce
- 14 or eliminate altogether funding for other local programs; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The strained finances of municipal governments
- 16 combined with a lack of assistance from State government has
- 17 left most local police forces lacking many of the resources that

- 1 would be beneficial in their fight against crime; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The ability of local police to access information
- 3 available to them in an expeditious manner is vital to their
- 4 crime-fighting efforts; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Computerized central records repositories would
- 6 prove to be an invaluable asset for police; and
- WHEREAS, County sheriffs' departments presently have access
- 8 to databases such as the National Crime Information Center and
- 9 the Commonwealth Law Enforcement Assistance Network; therefore
- 10 be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Local
- 12 Government Commission to undertake a study to determine the
- 13 feasibility and cost of developing and implementing a
- 14 computerized central records repository in each of the county
- 15 sheriff's departments to which local police departments would
- 16 have access.
