## AN ACT

Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR BUDGET AND FEES; <-2 3 AND providing for State correctional institutions. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 66 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 SECTION 1. SECTION 2414(B) OF TITLE 66 OF THE PENNSYLVANIA CONSOLIDATED STATUTES IS AMENDED TO READ: 10 § 2414. BUDGET AND FEES. \* \* \* 11 (B) FISCAL YEAR BUDGET AND FEES. --12 (1)THE FISCAL YEAR FOR THE FUND SHALL COMMENCE ON JULY 13 1 OF EACH YEAR. [PRIOR TO THE CLOSE OF EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE] 14 15 THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A BUDGET AND PROPOSED FEE

SCHEDULE FOR THE COMING FISCAL YEAR ALONG WITH COMPREHENSIVE

- 1 FINANCIAL DATA FROM THE PAST FISCAL YEAR TO THE HOUSE
- 2 CONSUMER AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE CONSUMER PROTECTION
- 3 AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE COMMITTEE[. UNLESS EITHER] ON OR
- 4 <u>BEFORE MARCH 1 OF EACH YEAR. IF</u> THE SENATE [OR] <u>AND</u> THE HOUSE
- 5 OF REPRESENTATIVES [ACTS] <u>FAIL</u> TO DISAPPROVE THROUGH ADOPTION
- 6 OF A RESOLUTION [WITHIN TEN LEGISLATIVE DAYS FROM THE
- 7 SUBMISSION] BY JUNE 1, THE COMMISSION FEE SCHEDULE SHALL
- 8 BECOME EFFECTIVE SUBJECT TO RECALCULATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 9 <u>PARAGRAPH (2)</u>. THE COMMISSION SHALL NOTIFY ALL MEDALLION
- 10 HOLDERS OF THE FEE SCHEDULE FOR THE COMING FISCAL YEAR BY
- 11 CERTIFIED LETTER.
- 12 (2) NOT BEFORE JUNE 1 AND NO LATER THAN JULY 31 OF EACH
- 13 YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL RECALCULATE ITS FEE SCHEDULE BASED
- 14 ON FINANCIAL DATA AND OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION THAT BECAME
- 15 AVAILABLE FOLLOWING THE SUBMISSION OF THE PROPOSED FEE
- 16 SCHEDULE. IF THE RECALCULATION RESULTS IN REDUCED FEES, THE
- 17 FEE SCHEDULE SHALL BE ADJUSTED TO REFLECT THE REDUCTION.
- 18 OTHERWISE, NO ADJUSTMENT SHALL BE MADE TO THE SCHEDULE FOR
- 19 THE 1996-1997 FISCAL YEAR. FOR ANY SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEAR,
- THE FEE SCHEDULE MAY BE ADJUSTED TO REFLECT EITHER A
- 21 <u>REDUCTION OR INCREASE IN FEES. THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT</u>
- 22 ANY REVISED FEE SCHEDULE TO THE CONSUMER PROTECTION AND
- 23 PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE
- 24 <u>CONSUMER AFFAIRS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.</u>
- 25 THE COMMISSION SHALL NOTIFY ALL MEDALLION HOLDERS OF THE
- 26 REDUCED FEE SCHEDULE BY CERTIFIED LETTER. A MEDALLION HOLDER
- 27 WHO HAS PAID A FEE PRIOR TO ANY REDUCTION SHALL BE ENTITLED
- 28 <u>TO A REFUND OR CREDIT AS WARRANTED.</u>
- 29 SECTION 2. TITLE 66 IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ:
- 30 <u>§ 2907. State correctional institutions.</u>

- 1 (a) Identification of calls.--Telecommunication service
- 2 providers which provide telecommunication services to State
- 3 <u>correctional institutions shall identify all calls made by</u> <--
- 4 <u>inmates</u> TO THE CALLED PARTY ANY CALL MADE BY AN INMATE as
- 5 <u>originating from a State correctional facility INSTITUTION.</u> <---
- 6 (b) Collect calls. All personal calls made by inmates shall <--
- 7 (B) COLLECT CALLS.-- <—
- 8 (1) ALL CALLS MADE BY INMATES SHALL be collect calls
- 9 <u>only. The person receiving the call shall be notified that</u> <-
- 10 <u>the call may be recorded or monitored.</u>
- 11 (2) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (1), IN THE CASE OF AN <---
- 12 EMERGENCY, THE SUPERINTENDENT MAY AUTHORIZE A PHONE CALL TO
- BE MADE UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF STAFF. THE CHARGE FOR THE
- 14 CALL SHALL BE BORNE BY THE INMATE.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
- 16 SECTION 3. THE AMENDMENT OF 66 PA.C.S. § 2414(B) SHALL BE <---
- 17 RETROACTIVE TO JUNE 1, 1996.
- 18 SECTION 4. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT AS FOLLOWS:
- 19 (1) THE ADDITION OF 66 PA.C.S. § 2907 SHALL TAKE EFFECT
- 20 IN 60 DAYS.
- 21 (2) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT
- 22 IMMEDIATELY.
