A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, providing for consideration of bills in each house.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
8	That section 4 of Article III be amended to read:
9	§ 4. Consideration of bills.
10	Every bill shall be considered on three different days in
11	each House. All amendments made thereto shall be printed for the
12	use of the members before the final vote is taken on the bill
13	and before the final vote is taken, upon written request
14	addressed to the presiding officer of either House by at least
15	25% of the members elected to that House, any bill shall be read
16	at length in that House. Each bill which receives an affirmative
17	vote in its house of origin and is transmitted to the other

house and referred to committee shall be considered and voted 1 upon by the receiving committee prior to the end of the 2 3 legislative session in which it was introduced. No bill shall 4 become a law, unless on its final passage the vote is taken by 5 yeas and nays, the names of the persons voting for and against it are entered on the journal, and a majority of the members 6 elected to each House is recorded thereon as voting in its 7 8 favor.

9 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General 10 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 11 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article 12 13 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the 14 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in 15 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after 16 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

17 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this 18 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 19 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 20 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the 21 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 22 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 23 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 24 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the 25 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment 26 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first 27 primary, general or municipal election occurring at least three 28 months after the proposed constitutional amendment is passed by the General Assembly which meets the requirements of and is in 29 30 conformance with section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of 19970H0226B0248 - 2 -

1 Pennsylvania.
