AN ACT

- Providing for certain records and other information to be returned and made available by nursing homes; and providing for additional duties of the Department of Public Welfare.

 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:

 (1) That this Commonwealth has a large and growing
- population of senior and disabled persons whose family
 members and friends are increasingly dependent on nursing
 home care.
- 9 (2) That significant resources are necessary for the 10 care of our senior and disabled citizens who reside in 11 nursing homes.
- 12 (3) That the nursing home industry is a growth industry
 13 in this Commonwealth which requires immediate safeguards in
 14 the public interest.
- 15 (4) That for-profit nursing homes and nursing home 16 chains that receive public money have the responsibility to

- 1 report to residents and their families on safety and health
- 2 matters, quality-of-care issues and situations which pose
- 3 imminent or potential hazards to nursing home residents and
- 4 the people who care for them.
- 5 (5) That family members and friends have the right to
- 6 know the quality of care provided to their loved ones.
- 7 (6) That the public has the right to know information
- 8 affecting the care of senior and disabled residents in the
- 9 nearly 700 nursing homes across this Commonwealth.
- 10 (7) That the Department of Health and the Department of
- 11 Public Welfare are responsible to ensure that such moneys
- 12 appropriated by the General Assembly for that purpose are
- directed to nursing homes that provide quality care for our
- 14 senior and disabled citizens.
- 15 (8) That the Department of Public Welfare is responsible
- 16 to ensure that such funding is spent prudently in a manner
- which promotes and advances resident care.
- 18 (9) That senior and disabled citizens who are residents
- 19 of nursing homes should not have patient care appropriations
- 20 used for payment of legal representation costs in defense of
- 21 unlawful conduct.
- 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 23 hereby enacts as follows:
- 24 Section 1. Maintenance of records.
- 25 Any nursing home corporation operating within this
- 26 Commonwealth shall maintain the following records for a ten-year
- 27 period:
- 28 (1) Safety and health inspections.
- 29 (2) Occupational Safety and Health Act complaints under
- 30 the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (Public Law

- 1 91-596, 29 U.S.C. § 651 et seq.).
- 2 (3) Wage and hour complaints before the United States
- 3 Department of Labor.
- 4 (4) Actions before the National Labor Relations Board.
- 5 (5) Actions before the Health Care Financing
- 6 Administration.
- 7 Section 2. Public right to information.
- 8 A nursing home corporation receiving public funding shall
- 9 notify the public of its right to the information set forth in
- 10 section 1. This notice shall be posted in a conspicuous place
- 11 accessible and visible to the public at each facility. This
- 12 information must be made available for the current year and the
- 13 two years immediately prior to the current year.
- 14 Section 3. Nursing staff.
- 15 A nursing home corporation receiving public funding shall
- 16 post the number of nursing staff directly responsible for
- 17 resident care. This information shall be posted for each shift,
- 18 each day and each floor for each job classification. This
- 19 information must be posted in a location which is visible and
- 20 accessible to all residents, their families and caregivers in
- 21 each facility.
- 22 Section 4. Notification of hazard.
- 23 A nursing home corporation shall immediately notify the
- 24 family of every resident of those incidents in which residents
- 25 and workers are evacuated from the facility or which pose an
- 26 imminent hazard to residents or workers.
- 27 Section 5. Enforcement.
- The Department of Public Welfare shall monitor nursing home
- 29 corporations for compliance with this act. Nursing home
- 30 corporations which use public funding for legal representation

- 1 in defense of unlawful activities shall have public funds
- 2 withheld in an amount equal to funds improperly used and the
- 3 cost of enforcement.
- 4 Section 6. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days. 5
