## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Directing a select committee to study the ramifications of
- 2 repealing The Local Tax Enabling Act and taxation provisions
- of local government codes and authorizing local government
- 4 units to devise their own systems of taxation.
- 5 WHEREAS, Taxpayers across this Commonwealth are in desperate
- 6 need of local tax reform; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Local officials are in the best position to know the
- 8 desires of their residents for services and the ability of their
- 9 residents to pay local taxes; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Legislation may be proposed to repeal the act of
- 11 December 31, 1965 (P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax
- 12 Enabling Act, and the taxation provisions of local government
- 13 codes; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 15 form a select committee to study the ramifications of repealing
- 16 The Local Tax Enabling Act and taxation provisions of local
- 17 government codes and authorizing local government units to
- 18 devise their own systems of taxation; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the committee shall be comprised of six
- 2 members as follows:
- 3 (1) a member to be appointed by the President pro
- 4 tempore of the Senate, by the Majority Leader of the Senate
- 5 and by the Minority Leader of the Senate; and
- 6 (2) a member to be appointed by the Speaker of the House
- of Representatives, by the Majority Leader of the House of
- 8 Representatives and by the Minority Leader of the House of
- 9 Representatives;
- 10 and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That these appointments are to be made within 30
- 12 days of adoption of this resolution by the Senate and the House
- 13 of Representatives; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the select committee may hold hearings, take
- 15 testimony and make its investigations at such places as it deems
- 16 necessary in this Commonwealth. Each member of the select
- 17 committee shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations
- 18 to witnesses appearing before the select committee; and be it
- 19 further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the select committee shall prepare a report
- 21 with findings and recommendations to the Finance Committee of
- 22 the Senate and the Finance Committee of the House of
- 23 Representatives. The report of the select committee shall be
- 24 submitted within six months of adoption of this resolution by
- 25 the Senate and the House of Representatives.
