- 1 Marking April 15, 1997, as the 50th Year Anniversary celebrating
- 2 Jackie Robinson's breaking baseball major league's racial
- 3 barrier.
- 4 WHEREAS, Baseball legend Jackie Robinson was the first
- 5 African-American to play Major League Baseball; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Jackie Robinson rose from poverty to become one of
- 7 the greatest athletes of our time; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Robinson overcame tremendous racial prejudice in
- 9 an era that sanctioned segregation and became an icon for the
- 10 civil rights movement; and
- 11 WHEREAS, He was a role model for generations of African-
- 12 American youths and gave them hope that racial prejudice could
- 13 be overcome; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Jackie Robinson was named baseball's first "Rookie
- 15 of the Year" in 1947; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Mr. Robinson was inducted into the Baseball Hall of

- 1 Fame with a lifetime batting average of .311; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Major League Baseball has dedicated this year's
- 3 season to the 50th Anniversary of Jackie Robinson's entry to the
- 4 league; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize April
- 6 15, 1997, as the 50th Year Anniversary celebrating and honoring
- 7 the achievements of Jackie Robinson and commemorate his legacy
- 8 in the world of baseball, to African-Americans and to all
- 9 Americans.
