A RESOLUTION

1 Designating the month of May 1998 as "Community Action Month" in
2 Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, There are 43 community action agencies in
4 Pennsylvania that work to assist the Commonwealth's low-income
5 population in breaking the cycle of poverty and achieving self-
6 sufficiency; and

7 WHEREAS, These agencies have been serving low-income families
8 in all counties of this Commonwealth for more than 31 years; and

9 WHEREAS, Community action agencies have been able to respond
10 to the local needs unique to each community through various
11 programs, including day-care programs, outreach and referral
12 services, food banks, transportation assistance for the elderly
13 in rural areas, weatherization programs, education and job

1 training and placement; and

2 WHEREAS, These programs help agencies to work with the low-
3 income population of Pennsylvania and attack the cause of
4 poverty; and

5 WHEREAS, Community action agencies, in partnership with
6 elected officials, the private sector and low-income citizens,
7 continue to identify poverty conditions and find solutions;
8 therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
10 month of May 1998 as "Community Action Month" in Pennsylvania.
