AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the establishment of an adult health care
- 2 assistance program, imposing additional powers and duties on
- 3 the Department of Health, the Insurance Department and the
- 4 Department of Public Welfare; and making an appropriation.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Adult Health
- 9 Care Assistance Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Adult." Any resident of this Commonwealth who is 55 years
- 15 of age or older and meets the requirements of section 3(b).
- 16 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 17 "Genetic status." The presence of a physical condition in an

- 1 individual which is a result of an inherited trait.
- 2 "Grantee." An entity selected by the Department of Health to
- 3 receive a grant. The term includes an entity, and its
- 4 subsidiary, which is established under 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61
- 5 (relating to hospital plan corporations) or 63 (relating to
- 6 professional health services plan corporations); the act of May
- 7 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law
- 8 of 1921; or the act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364),
- 9 known as the Health Maintenance Organization Act.
- 10 "Group." A group for which a health insurance policy is
- 11 written in this Commonwealth.
- 12 "Health maintenance organization" or "HMO." An entity
- 13 organized and regulated under the act of December 29, 1972
- 14 (P.L.1701, No.364), known as the Health Maintenance Organization
- 15 Act.
- 16 "Health service corporation." A professional health service
- 17 corporation as defined in 40 Pa.C.S. § 6302 (relating to
- 18 definitions).
- 19 "Hospital." An institution having an organized medical staff
- 20 which is engaged primarily in providing to inpatients, by or
- 21 under the supervision of physicians, diagnostic and therapeutic
- 22 services for the care of injured, disabled, pregnant, diseased
- 23 or sick or mentally ill persons. The term includes facilities
- 24 for the diagnosis and treatment of disorders within the scope of
- 25 specific medical specialties. The term does not include
- 26 facilities caring exclusively for the mentally ill.
- 27 "Hospital plan corporation." A hospital plan corporation as
- 28 defined in 40 Pa.C.S. § 6101 (relating to definitions).
- "Insurer." Any insurance company, association, reciprocal,
- 30 nonprofit hospital plan corporation, nonprofit professional

- 1 health service plan, health maintenance organization, fraternal
- 2 benefits society or a risk-bearing PPO or nonrisk-bearing PPO
- 3 not governed and regulated under the Employee Retirement Income
- 4 Security Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-406, 29 U.S.C. § 1001 et
- 5 seq.).
- 6 "MAAC." The Medical Assistance Advisory Committee.
- 7 "Managed care organization." A health maintenance
- 8 organization organized and regulated under the act of December
- 9 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364), known as the Health Maintenance
- 10 Organization Act, or a risk-assuming preferred provider
- 11 organization or exclusive provider organization, organized and
- 12 regulated under the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known
- 13 as The Insurance Company Law of 1921.
- 14 "Medical assistance." The State program of medical
- 15 assistance established under the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- 16 No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code.
- 17 "Mid-level health professional." A physician assistant,
- 18 certified registered nurse practitioner, nurse practitioner or a
- 19 certified nurse midwife.
- 20 "PPO." A preferred provider organization subject to the
- 21 provisions of section 630 of the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682,
- 22 No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921.
- 23 "Preexisting condition." A disease or physical condition for
- 24 which medical advice or treatment has been received prior to the
- 25 effective date of coverage.
- 26 "Secretary." The Secretary of Health.
- 27 "Subgroup." An employer covered under a contract issued to a
- 28 multiple employer trust or to an association.
- 29 "Terminate." Includes cancellation, nonrenewal and
- 30 rescission.

- 1 "Waiting period." A period of time after the effective date
- 2 of enrollment during which a health insurance plan excludes
- 3 coverage for the diagnosis or treatment of one or more medical
- 4 conditions.
- 5 Section 3. Adult Health Care Assistance Program.
- 6 (a) Establishment.--The Department of Health, in cooperation
- 7 with the Insurance Department and the Department of Public
- 8 Welfare, shall develop, implement and administer a program which
- 9 provides health care assistance for qualified adults by
- 10 utilizing a system of grantees who will provide health care
- 11 insurance for qualified adults.
- 12 (b) Qualified adult.--Any adult resident of this
- 13 Commonwealth who meets all of the requirements of this
- 14 subsection shall be eligible and may apply to the department for
- 15 health care assistance under this act. The requirements are as
- 16 follows:
- 17 (1) The adult is 55 years of age or older.
- 18 (2) The adult does not qualify for Medicare coverage.
- 19 (3) The adult has income from earned and unearned
- 20 sources which is above the Medicare income eligibility level
- 21 but not in excess of the State average individual income
- level.
- 23 (4) The adult has not canceled or terminated an existing
- health care insurance contract, policy or plan.
- 25 Section 4. Allocation of Commonwealth funds.
- 26 (a) Allocation. -- Annually the State Treasurer shall set
- 27 aside three-fourths of any payments derived from any damage
- 28 award or settlement resulting from litigation between the
- 29 Commonwealth and various defendant tobacco manufacturers.
- 30 (b) Appropriation.--All funds set aside under subsection (a)

- 1 are hereby appropriated on a continuing basis to the Department
- 2 of Health to implement and administer the provisions of this
- 3 act.
- 4 Section 5. Rules and regulations.
- 5 The Department of Health shall promulgate all rules and
- 6 regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this act.
- 7 Section 6. Effective date.
- 8 This act shall take effect January 1, 2000.
