## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, defining the offense of identity
- 3 theft.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 4120. Identity theft.
- 9 A person commits an offense of identity theft of another
- 10 person, a misdemeanor of the first degree, if he takes, assumes
- 11 or uses the identity, name, birth date, Social Security number
- 12 or identification of another person without the consent of that
- 13 other person and with the intent to:
- (1) cause financial loss to the other person;

- (2) obtain goods or services; or 1
- (3) otherwise assume or use the other person's identity 2
- for any unlawful purpose. 3
- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 4
