AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for gifted and talented education professional requirements; and further providing for special temporary or permanent certificates.
8	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
9	The General Assembly recognizes that one of this
10	Commonwealth's greatest assets is the minds of its students. The
11	General Assembly believes that all students deserve the highest
12	quality instruction possible and that this instruction will only
13	occur when teachers are aware of and able to respond to the
14	unique qualities and characteristics of the students they
15	instruct. In an effort to ensure that gifted and talented
16	students are provided the educational resources necessary to
17	meet their unique needs it is the intent of the General Assembly
18	to have educators learned in the most effective techniques to
19	challenge and inspire the intellect and creativity of gifted and
20	talented students.

- 1 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 2 hereby enacts as follows:
- 3 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 4 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 5 section to read:
- 6 Section 1205.2. Gifted and Talented Education Professional
- 7 Requirements. -- In addition to any other requirement of this act,
- 8 <u>a continuing professional development plan established under</u>
- 9 <u>section 1205.1 shall include education activities, learning</u>
- 10 experiences, professional education courses or collegiate study
- 11 <u>addressing gifted and talented education</u>.
- 12 Section 2. Section 1207 of the act is amended to read:
- 13 Section 1207. Special Temporary or Permanent Certificates.--
- 14 [The Superintendent of Public Instruction] (a) The Secretary of
- 15 Education shall provide for special examinations, and for
- 16 temporary or permanent certificates, for teachers of
- 17 kindergartens, gifted and talented, drawing, vocal music, manual
- 18 training, physical training and other special branches.
- 19 (b) The Department of Education shall develop written
- 20 <u>standards for teacher preparation program approval and teacher</u>
- 21 certification for certification in gifted and talented
- 22 education. Minimum standards for certification in gifted and
- 23 talented education shall include:
- 24 (1) a post-baccalaureate program with a minimum of six (6)
- 25 credit hours in education and psychology of the exceptional
- 26 child;
- 27 (2) twelve (12) credit hours in an elementary subject
- 28 <u>discipline or twenty-four (24) credit hours in a secondary</u>
- 29 <u>subject discipline;</u>
- 30 (3) a practicum of directed teaching experience with gifted

- 1 and talented students; and
- 2 (4) a minimum of three (3) years' teaching experience.
- 3 (c) A certification in gifted and talented education shall
- 4 be required of a professional who spends the majority of
- 5 teaching time with gifted and talented students in a public
- 6 school in this Commonwealth after June 30, 2000.
- 7 (d) The [Superintendent of Public Instruction] Secretary of
- 8 Education may issue temporary or permanent certificates for the
- 9 teaching of such special subjects to graduates of approved
- 10 special schools of such subjects, under such conditions as he
- 11 may make.
- 12 Section 3. The State Board of Education shall develop
- 13 regulations relative to the implementation and administration of
- 14 this act.
- 15 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
