AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for extension of benefits during active military duty.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 7309 of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 7309. Employment discrimination for military membership or
9	duty.
10	(a) General ruleIt is unlawful for the Commonwealth or
11	any of its departments, boards, commissions, agencies or any
12	political subdivision, or for any private employer, to refuse to
13	hire or employ any individual not on extended active duty
14	because of his membership in the National Guard or any one of

the other reserve components of the armed forces of the United 1 2 States, or because he is called or ordered to active State duty 3 or special State duty by the Governor during an emergency or as 4 otherwise authorized by law, or because he is called or ordered 5 to active duty by the Federal Government under provisions of 10 U.S.C. (relating to armed forces) or 32 U.S.C. (relating to 6 National Guard), or to discharge from employment such 7 individual, or to otherwise discriminate against such individual 8 9 with respect to compensation, hire, tenure, terms, conditions or 10 privileges of employment because of such membership, or because 11 he is called or ordered to active State duty by the Governor during an emergency or because he is called or ordered to other 12 13 military duty authorized by law.

14 (b) Reemployment following emergency or other military 15 duty.--Upon the completion of such emergency or other military 16 duty any such member of the Pennsylvania National Guard or any 17 other reserve component of the armed forces of the United States 18 shall be restored by such public or private employer or his successor in interest to such position or to a position of like 19 20 seniority, status and pay which such member held prior to such 21 emergency or other military duty, but if any such member is not 22 qualified to perform the duties of such position by reason of disability sustained during such emergency or other military 23 24 duty but qualified to perform the duties of any other position 25 in the employ of such private employer or his successor in 26 interest, such member shall be restored to such other position, 27 the duties of which he is qualified to perform, as will provide him like seniority, status and pay, or the nearest approximation 28 29 thereof consistent with the circumstances of the case, unless 30 such public or private employer's or his successor in interests, 19990H1630B1985 - 2 -

circumstances have so changed as to make it impossible or
 unreasonable to do so.

3 (c) Extension of benefits during military duty.--Whenever a 4 member of the Pennsylvania National Guard is called or ordered 5 into active Federal service or active State duty under orders authorized by law or a member of any reserve component is called 6 or ordered onto active duty, other than active duty for 7 training, the [public or] private employer of the member shall, 8 at no cost to the member, continue health insurance and other 9 10 benefits in effect for at least the first 30 days of the 11 military duty. After the expiration of the first 30 days, the [public or] private employer shall give the member of the 12 13 National Guard or other reserve component the voluntary option 14 of continuing such health insurance and other benefits in effect 15 at his own expense by paying for the insurance or benefits at the same rates paid by the employer, and the insurance coverage 16 17 shall continue, except for injuries incurred in the line of 18 military duty. The public employer, meaning the Commonwealth and any political subdivision, of any employee who is a member of 19 20 the National Guard who is called or ordered into active duty shall, at no cost to the member, continue health insurance and 21 22 other benefits in effect until the member has returned from 23 active military duty. If the public employer can not legally maintain such coverage, it shall be responsible for the payment 24 25 of all medical costs not paid by other insurance coverage of 26 such member or his dependents while the member is on active 27 military duty. The Commonwealth shall reimburse any political 28 subdivision or other local entity for costs incurred under this section. 29

30 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
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
