AN ACT

Providing for waiver of statutory and regulatory education 1 2 provisions by boards of school directors. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 4 5 Section 1. Short title. 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Public School 7 Mandate Waiver Act. Section 2. Definitions. 8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 9 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 11 12 "Department." The Department of Education of the 13 Commonwealth. 14 "Public School Code." The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949. 15

"Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
 Section 3. Mandate waivers.

3 (a) General rule.--Except as otherwise provided in this act, 4 the board of school directors of any school district may adopt a 5 resolution to waive any provision of the Public School Code, the 6 regulations of the State Board of Education or the standards of 7 the secretary if the waiver will enable the school district to 8 improve its instructional program or operate in a more 9 effective, efficient or economical manner.

10 (b) Application.--The application for a waiver shall be in a11 manner and a form developed by the department and shall:

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(1) Specify the need for the waiver.

13 (2) Provide supporting data and information to explain
14 the benefits to be obtained by the waiver and, when
15 applicable, to explain the instructional program that will
16 operate under the waiver.

17 (3) Include an evaluation procedure to determine the 18 effectiveness of an innovative program or programs; the 19 effectiveness of a revised instructional program, which shall 20 include measures of student performance; and the 21 effectiveness of changes in the operations of the school 22 district.

(c) Board resolution and approval by department.--The request for a waiver shall be adopted by a resolution of the board of school directors at a regularly scheduled meeting of the board. Prior to implementing the policies or procedures contained in the waiver, approval by the department shall be required.

29 (d) Time frame.--The department shall have 60 days from 30 receipt of the application to approve, disapprove or request 20000H2173B2833 - 2 - modifications to the application. If the department fails to act
 within that time period, the waiver shall be deemed to be
 approved.

4 (e) Disapproval and revision of application.--If the
5 department disapproves the application for waiver, the basis for
6 the department's disapproval shall be transmitted to the board
7 of school directors. The board of school directors may submit a
8 revised application for a waiver.

(f) Renewal of waiver.--Three years from the implementation 9 10 of the waiver, the board of school directors shall submit to the 11 department the evaluation set forth in subsection (b)(3). When the waiver evaluation indicates an improvement in student 12 13 performance, instructional program or school operations, the 14 waiver shall be renewed by the department and shall remain in 15 effect unless rescinded by the board of school directors. 16 Section 4. Waiver not applicable to certain Public School Code 17 provisions.

18 The following provisions of the Public School Code shall not 19 be subject to waiver pursuant to this act:

24 1327, 1327.1, 1330, 1332, 1361, 1366, 1501, 1502, 1513, 1517,
25 1518, 1521, 1523, 1546 and 1547.

26 (2) Provisions prohibiting discrimination and violence.
27 (3) Articles XI, XI-A, XII, XIII-A, XIV, XVII-A and
28 XVII-B.

29 Section 5. Waiver not applicable to certain regulations.
30 The following provisions of 22 Pa.Code (relating to
20000H2173B2833 - 3 -

1 education) shall not be subject to waiver pursuant to this act:

(1) Chapters 4 (relating to academic standards and
assessments), 11 (relating to pupil attendance), 12 (relating
to students) and 14 (relating to special education services
and programs).

6 (2) Sections 32.3 (relating to assurances), 121.3
7 (relating to discrimination prohibited), 235.4 (relating to
8 practices) and 235.8 (relating to civil rights).

9 Section 6. Other laws not affected.

10 No Federal or State law applicable to a public school that is 11 not within the provisions of this act shall be waived by a board 12 of school directors.

13 Section 7. Report.

A report shall be issued annually by the secretary to the General Assembly listing all waiver requests and department approvals or disapprovals under this act.

17 Section 8. Collective bargaining agreement.

18 Nothing in this act shall be construed to supersede or 19 preempt any provision of a collective bargaining agreement in 20 effect on the effective date of this act.

21 Section 9. Construction.

22 Nothing in this act shall be construed to supersede or 23 abrogate the following:

24 (1) Sections 751, 751.1, 756 and 757 of the Public
25 School Code to the extent that these sections are not
26 inconsistent with the act of December 20, 1967 (P.L.869,
27 No.385), known as the Public Works Contractors' Bond Law of
28 1967.

29 (2) Section 1 of the act of May 1, 1913 (P.L.155, 30 No.104), entitled "An act regulating the letting of certain 20000H2173B2833 - 4 - contracts for the erection, construction, and alteration of public buildings," the act of August 15, 1961 (P.L.987, No.442), known as the Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage Act, and the act of March 3, 1978 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Steel Products Procurement Act.

6 (3) Nonpublic transportation as provided in section 13617 of the Public School Code.

8 (4) A requirement of Federal law.

9 Section 10. Effective date.

10 This act shall take effect in 180 days.
