AN ACT

- 1 Requiring dormitories in public and private institutions of
 - higher education to conform to certain automatic sprinkler
- 3 system specifications; establishing a loan program; and
- 4 imposing penalties.

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- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Dormitory
- 9 Automatic Sprinkler System Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Department." The Department of Labor and Industry of the

- 1 Commonwealth.
- 2 "Dormitory." Any building owned by, or utilized by, an
- 3 institution of higher education which is used as a residence by
- 4 students. The term includes a building which is utilized or
- 5 owned by a fraternity or sorority which is recognized by the
- 6 institution of higher education.
- 7 "Institution of higher education." Any of the following:
- 8 (1) A community college operating under Article XIX-A of
- 9 the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the
- 10 Public School Code of 1949.
- 11 (2) A university comprising the State System of Higher
- 12 Education.
- 13 (3) Lincoln University.
- 14 (4) The Pennsylvania State University.
- 15 (5) Temple University.
- 16 (6) The University of Pittsburgh.
- 17 (7) A private college or university that is subject to
- 18 24 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 (relating to private colleges, universities
- 19 and seminaries).
- 20 Section 3. Automatic sprinkler systems.
- 21 (a) Requirements.--Each dormitory in this Commonwealth shall
- 22 be equipped with an automatic sprinkler system that satisfies
- 23 the requirements of Pamphlet 13 or 13R of the National Fire
- 24 Protection Association.
- 25 (b) Compliance periods for existing dormitories.--Except as
- 26 provided in subsections (c) and (d), a dormitory that exists on
- 27 the effective date of this act shall be in compliance with this
- 28 section not later than five years from the effective date of
- 29 this act.
- 30 (c) Conversion of existing buildings.--A building or

- 1 structure that exists on the effective date of this act and that
- 2 is converted into a dormitory shall be in compliance with
- 3 subsection (a) prior to the issuance of a certificate of
- 4 occupancy.
- 5 (d) Renovation of existing dormitories. -- A dormitory that
- 6 exists on the effective date of this act and that is renovated
- 7 at a cost in excess of 25% of the dormitory's taxable value
- 8 shall be in compliance with subsection (a) prior to the issuance
- 9 of a certificate of occupancy.
- 10 (e) New dormitories.--A dormitory that is constructed after
- 11 the effective date of this act shall be in compliance with
- 12 subsection (a) prior to the issuance of a certificate of
- 13 occupancy.
- (f) Variances from compliance requirements.--
- 15 (1) An institution of higher education or a fraternity
- or sorority subject to this act may apply to the department
- for a variance from the completion requirement of subsection
- 18 (b). The department shall promulgate, by regulation, the
- 19 format and procedure for the consideration of variance
- 20 requests. The department may grant a variance if it can be
- 21 demonstrated that the applicant is acting in good faith and
- 22 that compliance with subsection (b) would impose an
- 23 unreasonable hardship to the applicant. Possible factors
- justifying a variance include the availability of qualified
- contractors, the possible financial hardship imposed on an
- 26 applicant if the applicant were required to comply with the
- 27 original completion requirement and the possible negative
- 28 effects of the original completion requirement on the
- 29 availability of student housing. A variance under this
- 30 paragraph may not exceed two years from the original

- 1 completion requirement. A variance application must be
- 2 submitted no later than 42 months after the effective date of
- 3 this act.
- 4 (2) Irrespective of paragraph (1), the department may
- 5 extend the time frame required by subsection (b) for an
- 6 entity if an affected entity is unable to comply due to
- 7 reasons which are outside the control of the entity.
- 8 Section 4. Sprinkler Loan Program.
- 9 (a) Program. -- The department shall establish and administer
- 10 a loan program for the purpose of providing low-interest loans
- 11 to institutions of higher education, or fraternities or
- 12 sororities covered by this act, to install or retrofit automatic
- 13 water sprinkler systems or automatic fire suppression or control
- 14 systems in dormitories in order to comply with this act. Loan
- 15 payments shall be credited to the Sprinkler Loan Fund.
- 16 (b) Terms and conditions. -- Each loan approved by the
- 17 department under this act shall contain the following terms and
- 18 conditions:
- 19 (1) The loan shall be subject to interest at a rate of
- 20 2% per annum.
- 21 (2) The loan shall be repaid within 15 years of the date
- 22 of the loan.
- 23 (3) Any other terms and conditions as promulgated by the
- department.
- 25 (c) Application. -- The department shall develop an
- 26 application for loans from the fund. No loan shall be approved
- 27 by the department unless the applicant seeking the loan has
- 28 completed the application and agreed to the terms and conditions
- 29 required by the department.
- 30 (d) Sprinkler Loan Fund.--There is hereby established a

- 1 separate account in the State Treasury, to be known as the
- 2 Sprinkler Loan Fund, which shall be administered by the
- 3 department.
- 4 Section 5. Rules and regulations.
- 5 The department shall promulgate rules and regulations to
- 6 administer the provisions of this act.
- 7 Section 6. Requirements.
- 8 Participants in the sprinkler loan program under section 4
- 9 shall be subject to the following statutory requirements
- 10 governing construction projects and construction-related work:
- 11 (1) Section 1 of the act of May 1, 1913 (P.L.155,
- No.104), entitled, "An act regulating the letting of certain
- contracts for the erection, construction, and alteration of
- 14 public buildings."
- 15 (2) The act of August 15, 1961 (P.L.987, No.442), known
- 16 as the Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage Act.
- 17 (3) The act of December 20, 1967 (P.L.869, No.385),
- 18 known as the Public Works Contractors' Bond Law of 1967.
- 19 (4) The act of March 3, 1978 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the
- 20 Steel Products Procurement Act.
- 21 Section 7. Failure to comply with provisions of this act.
- 22 Whenever the owner of any dormitory, as described in this
- 23 act, shall fail to comply with this act, or the regulations
- 24 promulgated under this act, and upon whom a written order shall
- 25 have been served by the department to comply with the provisions
- 26 of this act and its regulations, and who fails to comply with
- 27 any written order within the time specified in the order, the
- 28 department is authorized to immediately order the dormitory to
- 29 be vacated or placed out of service until such time as the
- 30 requirements of this act and its regulations are fully complied

- 1 with.
- 2 Section 8. Enforcement.
- 3 For the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this act, all
- 4 the officers charged with its enforcement shall have the power
- 5 to enter any dormitory and no person shall hinder or delay or
- 6 interfere with any of the said officers in the performance of
- 7 their duty, nor refuse information necessary to determine
- 8 whether the provisions of this act and its regulations are or
- 9 will be complied with.
- 10 Section 9. Appropriation.
- 11 The sum of \$100,000,000 \$125,000,000 is hereby appropriated
- 12 from the General Fund to the Sprinkler Loan Fund.
- 13 Section 10. Penalties.
- 14 (a) Violation of act.--
- 15 (1) Any person that violates any provision of this act
- 16 commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be
- sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 and costs.
- 18 (2) Each day that a violation of this act continues
- shall be considered a separate violation.
- 20 (b) Disposition of penalties. -- The amount of the penalty
- 21 shall be forwarded to the department.
- 22 Section 11. Effective date.
- 23 This act shall take effect in 60 days JULY 1, 2001.

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
