1 2	Designating April 22, 1999, as "Take Our Daughters to Work Day" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, "Take Our Daughters to Work Day" is part of the Ms.
4	Foundation for Women's public education campaign that helps keep
5	girls healthy, confident and resilient during adolescence; and
6	WHEREAS, "Take Our Daughters to Work Day," now in its seventh
7	year, provides opportunities for businesses, educators,
8	community-based organizations and government officials to make
9	girls visible, valued and heard; and
10	WHEREAS, Last year, millions of girls across the country and
11	around the world went to workplaces with caring adult mentors

1 who paid attention to the girls' ideas and future plans and 2 showed them all the different life options that are available to 3 women; and

WHEREAS, "Take Our Daughters to Work Day" has provided many
government officials and employees with the opportunity to
better understand the challenges today's young women face
economically, socially and physically; therefore be it
