A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commemorating the 95th anniversary of the establishment of the
- 2 Pennsylvania State Police.
- 3 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State Police was established by an
- 4 act of the General Assembly that was signed into law by Governor
- 5 Samuel W. Pennypacker on May 2, 1905; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The original complement of only 228 men was
- 7 responsible for patrolling the entire 45,000 square miles of
- 8 this Commonwealth; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In 1923 the State Highway Patrol was established
- 10 within the Department of Highways; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The State Highway Patrol was consolidated with the
- 12 State Police in June 1937 and became known as the Pennsylvania
- 13 Motor Police; and

- 1 WHEREAS, In 1943 the name of the department was restored to
- 2 the Pennsylvania State Police; and
- 3 WHEREAS, As a result of increased demands for its services,
- 4 the Pennsylvania State Police now consists of 4,157 police
- 5 personnel and more than 1,200 civilian personnel; therefore be
- 6 it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commemorate the
- 8 95th anniversary of the Pennsylvania State Police and commend
- 9 all present and former personnel of the Pennsylvania State
- 10 Police on the outstanding services they have performed for this
- 11 Commonwealth.
