## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled, as

amended, "An act to promote the public health and safety by 2 3 providing for examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who desire to engage in the profession of 4 5 cosmetology; defining cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology shops, schools, students, apprentices, teachers, managers, 7 manicurists and cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational 8 Affairs in the Department of State; providing for appeals to 9 10 certain courts by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," further providing for practice in cosmetology 11 12 shops. 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. Section 8 of the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, 16 No.86), referred to as the Cosmetology Law, amended June 30, 1984 (P.L.479, No.100), is amended to read: 17 Section 8. Practice in Cosmetology Shops Only .-- It shall be 18 19 unlawful for any person to practice cosmetology for pay in any 20 place other than a licensed cosmetology shop, manicurist shop or 21 barber shop as defined in the act of June 19, 1931 (P.L.589,

- 1 No.202), referred to as the Barbers' License Law: Provided, That
- 2 a licensed cosmetologist or a licensed manicurist may furnish
- 3 cosmetology treatments or manicuring services to persons in
- 4 residences of such persons by appointment.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
