AN ACT

- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 2
- Statutes, providing for unlawful sound amplification systems.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- § 4523.1. Sound amplification systems.
- 8 (a) General rule. -- No person shall operate or permit the
- operation of any sound amplification system, including, but not
- 10 limited to, a radio, tape player, compact disc player or any
- other mechanical or nonmechanical sound-making device, which can 11
- 12 be heard outside a motor vehicle from 50 or more feet away.
- 13 (b) Application. -- This section shall not apply to:
- 14 (1) Any emergency or law enforcement vehicle equipped
- with a sound-making system used to warn of an emergency or 15

- 1 <u>hazardous situation or to request assistance.</u>
- 2 (2) Any authorized emergency vehicle or vehicle operated
- 3 by a public utility provider which is providing information
- 4 <u>or a warning deemed to serve the public safety.</u>
- 5 (3) The sound systems of a vehicle for which a local
- 6 permit has been issued to be used for advertising, parades,
- 7 political, charitable or other events as so prescribed by
- 8 local ordinance.
- 9 (c) Penalty. -- A person who violates subsection (a) commits a
- 10 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay
- 11 <u>a fine of not more than \$100.</u>
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
