1 2 3	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to the finances of the State government; providing for the settlement, assessment,
4	collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts
5	due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and
6	other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth,
7	or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the
8	proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other
9	disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the
10	possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims
11	against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and
12	appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to
13	the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth
14	and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting
15	moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
16	and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,
17	authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes
18	to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of
19	section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of
20	Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of
21	certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every
22	department, board, commission, and officer of the State
23	government, every political subdivision of the State, and
24	certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,
25	association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or
26	collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws
27	imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or
28	other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
29	every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the
30	Commonwealth, " defining "cost of the retailer" for purposes
31	of cigarette sales and licensing.

32 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

1 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The definition of "cost of the retailer" in section 202-A of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, added July 2, 1993 (P.L.250, No.46), is amended to read:

6 Section 202-A. Definitions.--As used in this article-7 * * *

8 "Cost of the Retailer" shall mean the basic cost of cigarettes to the retailer plus the cost of doing business by 9 10 the retailer in excess of the basic cost of cigarettes, 11 expressed as a percentage and applied to the basic cost of cigarettes. In the absence of filing of satisfactory proof of a 12 13 lesser or higher cost of doing business by the retailer making 14 the sale, the cost of doing business by the retailer shall be 15 presumed to be [six] ten per centum of the basic cost of 16 cigarettes to the retailer. When a retailer establishes a lesser 17 cost of doing business than the presumptive [six] ten per centum 18 cost of doing business, such lesser cost of doing business may be used to compute the cost of the retailer for a period of time 19 20 no greater than twelve months, at the end of which time the cost 21 to the retailer shall be computed using the presumptive [six] 22 ten per centum cost of doing business, unless the retailer again 23 establishes a lesser cost of doing business. Any fractional part 24 of a cent in such cost per carton shall be rounded off to the 25 next higher cent. In the case of any person who purchases cigarettes for sale at retail from any manufacturer of 26 cigarettes without resort to a wholesaler as such, such person 27 shall be deemed, for the purposes of this article, to be engaged 28 29 in the sale of cigarettes as a stamping agent, wholesaler and 30 retailer and as such shall be subject to all mark-up provisions - 2 -20020H2814B4245

- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
