A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study
 the elimination or significant reduction of property taxes as
 a source of funding for local school districts; to review the
 policies of states and jurisdictions of the United States
 which have eliminated property taxes as a source of funding
 for local school districts; to determine the consequences of
 such an elimination or reduction on local taxing bodies and
 on this Commonwealth; and to make recommendations on
 alternative financing methods for schools.
- 10 WHEREAS, Property taxes levied by local school districts have
- 11 become a tremendous burden upon homeowners and property owners
- 12 in this Commonwealth; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Senior citizens and individuals on fixed incomes
- 14 have been the most detrimentally affected by the property tax
- 15 system; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Problems with fairness in the property tax system
- 17 have dated back more than 30 years in parts of this

- 1 Commonwealth; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Several states and jurisdictions including Michigan
- 3 have sought to eliminate or significantly reduce reliance on
- 4 property taxes as a source of funding for local jurisdictions
- 5 and found alternative funding sources for counties, school
- 6 districts, municipalities and other local jurisdictions;
- 7 therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
- 9 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to undertake a study of
- 10 the property tax system in this Commonwealth in order to
- 11 ascertain whether property taxes can and should be eliminated or
- 12 significantly reduced as a source of funding for local school
- 13 districts and, if so, to recommend alternative funding sources
- 14 for those local school districts which are more fair and
- 15 equitable to the citizens of this Commonwealth; and be it
- 16 further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 18 initially review the policies of states and jurisdictions of the
- 19 United States which have eliminated property taxes as a source
- 20 of funding for local school districts and determine the
- 21 consequences that such eliminations or reductions would have on
- 22 local taxing bodies and on this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 24 make recommendations of alternative funding sources for local
- 25 school districts which are more fair and equitable, and no less
- 26 fair or less equitable, to citizens of this Commonwealth than
- 27 the current property tax system; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 29 report its findings and recommendations to the House of
- 30 Representatives not later than June 30, 2002.
