A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of November 3 through 9, 2002, as "Adult Day Services Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Adult day services are one of the fastest growing
- 4 components of community-based long-term care and are a
- 5 significant component in Pennsylvania's long-term care
- 6 continuum; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The number of adult day services centers has grown
- 8 from six licensed centers in this Commonwealth in 1980 to
- 9 approximately 250 centers licensed by the Pennsylvania
- 10 Department of Aging today; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Adult day services enable older adults to remain in

- 1 their homes rather than be placed in a residential nursing or
- 2 personal care facility; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Adult day services provide a significant respite for
- 4 caregivers, enabling them to work outside of the home or to take
- 5 a much-needed break from the rigors of 24-hour caregiving;
- 6 therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 8 week of November 3 through 9, 2002, as "Adult Day Services Week"
- 9 in Pennsylvania.
