AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled, as reenacted and amended, "An act concerning townships of the
- 3 second class; and amending, revising, consolidating and
- 4 changing the law relating thereto, "further providing for
- 5 acquisition of lands and buildings.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 2201 of the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103,
- 9 No.69), known as The Second Class Township Code, reenacted and
- 10 amended November 9, 1995 (P.L.350, No.60), is amended to read:
- 11 Section 2201. Acquisition of Lands and Buildings.--The board
- 12 of supervisors may designate lands or buildings owned, leased or
- 13 controlled by the township for use as parks, playgrounds,
- 14 playfields, gymnasiums, swimming pools, indoor recreation
- 15 centers, public parks and other recreation areas and facilities
- 16 and acquire lands or buildings by lease, gift, devise, purchase
- 17 or by the exercise of the right of eminent domain for
- 18 recreational purposes and construct and equip facilities for

- 1 recreational purposes. The right to acquire lands or buildings
- 2 <u>for recreational purposes through eminent domain shall exist</u>
- 3 only to acquire property reserved for future taking as shown on
- 4 an official map of the township adopted pursuant to Article IV
- 5 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.805, No.247), known as the
- 6 "Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code," which official map
- 7 shows elements of the township comprehensive plan, if any,
- 8 <u>adopted pursuant to Article III of the "Pennsylvania</u>
- 9 Municipalities Planning Code, and which elements are generally
- 10 consistent with the county comprehensive plan.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
