Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public 3 welfare laws of the Commonwealth, "FURTHER PROVIDING FOR HEALTH CARE PROVIDER RETENTION ACCOUNT; providing for personal needs allowance deduction for medical assistance eligible persons in nursing facilities; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN TIME PERIODS RELATING TO ICFS/MR, FOR PODIATRISTS IN THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS RETENTION PROGRAM AND FOR THE EXPIRATION OF THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER RETENTION PROGRAM. 9 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 11 12 Section 1. - 6 IN THE ACCOUNT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO AN ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BY
- 7 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO THE DEPARTMENT. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
- 8 ADMINISTER FUNDS APPROPRIATED UNDER THIS SECTION CONSISTENT WITH
- 9 ITS DUTIES UNDER SECTION 201(1).
- 10 (B) BY DECEMBER 31 OF EACH YEAR, THE SECRETARY OF THE BUDGET
- 11 [SHALL] MAY TRANSFER FROM THE MEDICAL CARE AVAILABILITY AND
- 12 REDUCTION OF ERROR (MCARE) FUND ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 712(A) OF
- 13 THE ACT OF MARCH 20, 2002 (P.L.154, NO.13), KNOWN AS THE
- 14 "MEDICAL CARE AVAILABILITY AND REDUCTION OF ERROR (MCARE) ACT,"
- 15 TO THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER RETENTION ACCOUNT AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO
- 16 THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE AMOUNT DEPOSITED UNDER SECTION 712(M)
- 17 OF THE MEDICAL CARE AVAILABILITY AND REDUCTION OF ERROR (MCARE)
- 18 ACT AND THE AMOUNT GRANTED AS DISCOUNTS UNDER SECTION 712(E)(2)
- 19 OF THE MEDICAL CARE AVAILABILITY AND REDUCTION OF ERROR (MCARE)
- 20 ACT, FOR THAT CALENDAR YEAR.
- 21 (B.1) THE SECRETARY OF THE BUDGET MAY ANNUALLY TRANSFER FROM
- 22 THE HEALTHCARE PROVIDER RETENTION ACCOUNT TO THE MEDICAL CARE
- 23 AVAILABILITY AND REDUCTION OF ERROR (MCARE) FUND ESTABLISHED IN
- 24 <u>SECTION 712(A) OF THE ACT OF MARCH 20, 2002 (P.L.154, NO.13),</u>
- 25 KNOWN AS THE MEDICAL CARE AVAILABILITY AND REDUCTION OF ERROR
- 26 ACT, AN AMOUNT UP TO THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF ABATEMENTS GRANTED
- 27 BY THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT UNDER SECTION 1304-A(B).
- 28 (C) THE DEPARTMENT MAY DEPOSIT ANY OTHER FUNDS RECEIVED BY
- 29 THE DEPARTMENT WHICH IT DEEMS APPROPRIATE IN THE HEALTH CARE
- 30 PROVIDER RETENTION ACCOUNT.

- 1 (D) THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO THE
- 2 DEPARTMENT IN ADMINISTERING THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER RETENTION
- 3 ACCOUNT.
- 4 SECTION 2. THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ:
- 5 <u>Section 443.7 443.8. Personal Needs Allowance Deduction for <---</u>
- 6 Medical Assistance Eligible Persons in Nursing Facilities. -- (a)
- 7 A personal needs allowance of not less than forty dollars (\$40)
- 8 per month, for clothing and other personal needs, shall be
- 9 <u>deducted from a medical assistance eliqible person's gross</u>
- 10 income, as defined by departmental regulation, for purposes of
- 11 determining the amount that person must pay toward the cost of
- 12 <u>skilled health care and intermediate services or intermediate</u>
- 13 <u>care while residing in a nursing facility.</u>
- 14 (b) The personal needs allowance under subsection (a) shall
- 15 be increased to not less than forty-five dollars (\$45) beginning

- 19 SECTION 811-C. TIME PERIODS.
- 20 THE ASSESSMENT AUTHORIZED IN THIS ARTICLE SHALL NOT BE
- 21 IMPOSED PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2003, FOR PRIVATE ICFS/MR AND JULY 1,
- 22 2004, FOR PUBLIC ICFS/MR, AND SHALL CEASE ON JUNE 30, 2009, OR
- 23 EARLIER IF REQUIRED BY LAW.
- 24 SECTION 4. SECTIONS 1301-A AND 1302-A OF THE ACT, ADDED

- 5 "ASSESSMENT." THE ASSESSMENT IMPOSED UNDER SECTION 712(D) OF
- 6 THE ACT OF MARCH 20, 2002 (P.L.154, NO.13), KNOWN AS THE MEDICAL
- 7 CARE AVAILABILITY AND REDUCTION OF ERROR (MCARE) ACT.
- 8 "EMERGENCY PHYSICIAN." A PHYSICIAN WHO IS CERTIFIED BY THE
- 9 AMERICAN BOARD OF EMERGENCY MEDICINE AND WHO IS EITHER EMPLOYED
- 10 FULL TIME BY A TRAUMA CENTER OR IS WORKING UNDER AN EXCLUSIVE
- 11 CONTRACT WITH A TRAUMA CENTER.
- 12 "HEALTH CARE PROVIDER." AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS ALL OF THE
- 13 FOLLOWING:
- 14 (1) A PHYSICIAN, LICENSED PODIATRIST OR CERTIFIED NURSE
- 15 MIDWIFE.
- 16 (2) A PARTICIPATING HEALTH CARE PROVIDER AS DEFINED IN
- 17 SECTION 702 OF THE ACT OF MARCH 20, 2002 (P.L.154, NO.13),
- 18 KNOWN AS THE MEDICAL CARE AVAILABILITY AND REDUCTION OF ERROR
- 19 (MCARE) ACT.
- 20 "MCARE ACT." THE ACT OF MARCH 20, 2002 (P.L.154, NO.13),
- 21 KNOWN AS THE MEDICAL CARE AVAILABILITY AND REDUCTION OF ERROR
- 22 (MCARE) ACT.
- 23 "PROGRAM." THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER RETENTION PROGRAM
- 24 ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 1302-A.
- 25 "TRAUMA CENTER." A HOSPITAL ACCREDITED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 26 TRAUMA SYSTEMS FOUNDATION AS A LEVEL I OR LEVEL II TRAUMA
- 27 CENTER.
- 28 SECTION 1302-A. ABATEMENT PROGRAM.
- 29 THERE IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED WITHIN THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT A
- 30 PROGRAM TO BE KNOWN AS THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER RETENTION

- 1 PROGRAM. THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE
- 2 DEPARTMENT, SHALL ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM. THE PROGRAM SHALL
- 3 PROVIDE ASSISTANCE IN THE FORM OF ASSESSMENT ABATEMENTS TO
- 4 HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS FOR CALENDAR YEARS 2003 [AND 2004.], 2004
- 5 AND 2005, EXCEPT THAT LICENSED PODIATRISTS SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE
- 6 FOR CALENDAR YEARS 2003 AND 2004.
- 7 SECTION 5. SECTION 1310-A OF THE ACT, ADDED DECEMBER 23,
- 8 2003 (P.L.237, NO.44), IS AMENDED TO READ:
- 9 SECTION 1310-A. EXPIRATION.
- 10 THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER RETENTION PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER
- 11 THIS ARTICLE SHALL EXPIRE DECEMBER 31, [2005] 2006.
- 12 Section 2 6. Any regulations or parts of regulations are <-
- 13 hereby abrogated to the extent of any inconsistency with this
- 14 act.
- 15 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
- 16 SECTION 7. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT AS FOLLOWS: <
- 17 (1) THE ADDITION OF SECTION 443.8 OF THE ACT SHALL TAKE
- 18 EFFECT IN 90 DAYS.
- 19 (2) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT
- 20 IMMEDIATELY.
