AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, further providing for the offense of resisting or
- 3 interfering with an officer; and prescribing penalties.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 904 of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 904. Resisting or interfering with an officer.
- 9 (a) General offense. -- When an officer is in the performance
- 10 of any duty required by this title, it is unlawful for any
- 11 person to [resist or interfere in any manner or to any degree or
- 12 to refuse to produce identification upon request of the
- 13 officer.] interfere with or resist an arrest, inspection or
- 14 investigation of the officer by threat, force, menace, flight or
- 15 <u>obstruction</u>. A violation of this [section] <u>subsection</u> is a
- 16 summary offense of the first degree.
- 17 (b) Failure to produce identification upon demand.--

- 1 (1) A person who refuses to provide identification upon
 2 demand of an officer whose duty it is to enforce this title
 3 after having been told by the officer that the person is the
 4 subject of an official investigation commits a summary
 5 offense of the fifth degree.
- 6 (2) A person who provides false identification to an
 7 officer whose duty it is to enforce this title for the
 8 purpose of avoiding prosecution or hindering apprehension or
 9 obstructing an investigation commits a summary offense of the
 10 second degree.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
