AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled, as reenacted and amended, "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating and changing the law relating thereto," further providing for auditor's compensation.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 902 of the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103,
- 9 No.69), known as The Second Class Township Code, reenacted and
- 10 amended November 9, 1995 (P.L.350, No.60), and amended June 22,
- 11 1999 (P.L.114, No.17), is amended to read:
- 12 Section 902. Auditor's Compensation.--(a) Each auditor
- 13 shall receive [ten dollars (\$10)] twelve dollars (\$12) for each
- 14 hour necessarily employed in the duties of the office upon
- 15 presentation to the board of supervisors of an itemized listing
- 16 of the dates, times, places and hours worked to perform the
- 17 audit. No auditor in a township having a population of ten
- 18 thousand or less is entitled to receive more than one thousand
- 19 dollars (\$1,000) for completing the annual audit, settlement and

- 1 adjustment. No auditor in a township having a population in
- 2 excess of ten thousand is entitled to receive more than two
- 3 thousand dollars (\$2,000) for completing the annual audit,
- 4 settlement and adjustment.
- 5 (b) In addition to the time actually used by the board of
- 6 auditors to complete the audit, settlement and adjustment, each
- 7 auditor may be compensated at the rate of [ten dollars (\$10)]
- 8 twelve dollars (\$12) each hour for not more than fifty hours to
- 9 audit the accounts of any public official who handles public
- 10 funds when a vacancy occurs in the office of the public
- 11 official.
- 12 (c) Each auditor shall be reimbursed for travel costs
- 13 incurred in the performance of the auditing duties at the rate
- 14 established by the board of supervisors under the act of July
- 15 20, 1979 (P.L.156, No.51), referred to as the Uniform Mileage
- 16 Fee Law, and for other expenses, including postage, notary fees
- 17 or publication costs, incurred during the audit.
- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
